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## SOLDIER ALSO A DIPLOMAT

### Interesting Facts About General Bates, the New Commander.

### PROMINENT IN THE PHILIPPINE WAR

Recently Appointed Head of Department of the Missouri is Equally Skilled in Fighting and Peace-making.

General John C. Bates, who has been ordered to relinquish his command in the Philippines that he may assume command of the Department of the Missouri, has figured prominently in the Philippine war. He will probably be accompanied to Omaha by Lieutenant William B. Cowin, son of General John C. Cowin of Omaha, who is an aid on the personal staff of General Bates.

When General Bates went to Zamboanga to bid farewell to the sultan and Datto Mandi before going to Manila to assume command of the Department of Southern Luzon, Datto Mandi gave a bull fight in the general's honor. Omaha cannot offer such a gory entertainment in welcoming the general, but his welcome will be hearty nevertheless.

Datto Mandi is a great favorite with the sultan of Mindanao and has been named as heir to the throne. In declaring his allegiance to the United States and to General Bates Datto Mandi exclaimed, "My legs, my arms, my head and my heart are all American." The man pointed his chest to emphasize his devotion.

## Fashions for the Season

3782 Fancy Waist, 32 to 40 in. bust

Woman's Fancy Waist, No. 3782—The waist with bolero effect and narrow full front in very generally becoming and is essentially smart. The attractive model illustrated is made from velveteen in Russian blue trimmed with Russian lace, with front and undersleeves of embroidered chiffon. The style is appropriate for almost all the season's materials, abtrows wool crepe, serge, crepe, foulard and all the long list of soft silks and wools.

The fitted lining closes at the center front and consists of the usual pieces. On it are arranged the seamstress back, the soft fronts and the full vest, which last is attached permanently to the right side and is hooked into place at the left. The fronts are extended to form the revers which meet the sailor collar that is joined to the neck, and the trimming is arranged to give a tolerable effect, over lines indicated in the pattern. The sleeves are made over a fitted lining to which the full undersleeves are attached, the upper portions being finished separately and slipped over the whole. As shown the lining beneath the full portions is white silk, but if preferred, the foundation can be cut away, leaving them transparent and allowing glimpses of the wrists.

To cut this waist for a woman of medium size 2 yards of material 21 inches wide, 2 1/2 yards 27 inches wide or 1 1/2 yards 44 inches wide will be required, with 1 yard of chiffon, 3/4 yard of all-over lace and 3/4 yard of insertion to trim as illustrated.
