

CONFERENCE SAVES CENTRAL

New Jersey Road Concedes Enough to Prevent Threatened Strike.

ENGINEERS AND FIREMEN GET RAISE

Telegraphers and Train Hands Received Only Promise of Increased Pay When They Produce Proof of Unfair Practice.

NEW YORK, April 13.—It was announced by officials of the Central railroad of New Jersey this evening that the company had come to an agreement with its engineers and firemen.

After the conference Timothy Shea, representative of the firemen in Jersey City, announced that there would be no strike on the New Jersey Central road.

LINCOLN MAN'S APPOINTMENT

Evidence of Administration's Intent to Continue Direction of Cuban Affairs.

WASHINGTON, April 13.—(Special Telegram.)—The appointment of Charles E. Magooz of Lincoln to be law officer of the insular division of the War department, now under the direction of Lieutenant Colonel Clarence Edwards of the army, which was made today by the president, while not in the nature of a promotion from his present position, is regarded here as indicating a desire on the part of the War department officials to take care of who came into the department during ex-Assistant Secretary McKeljohn's tenure.

CUBAN PARTIES COMPROMISE

Conservatives Force Radicals to Abandon Pledging the Convention.

COMMISSION NOW GOES TO WASHINGTON

Will Not Be Authorized to Settle Question of Relationship Definitely, but Will Secure President's Explanation.

HAVANA, April 13.—At the opening of today's secret session of the constitutional convention Senator Nunez asked that the convention either reject or accept the Platt amendment, as the resolution adopted yesterday was not a formal declaration and was misleading.

The conservatives considered that the resolution practically rejected the amendment, while the radicals and the radical press maintained that it did not, and Senator Nunez therefore asked that a vote be taken. This was opposed by the radicals, who have always avoided taking a decided stand.

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SEQUEL TO NEGRO'S BURNING

Father of Fred Alexander Asks Arrest of Lawrence O'Connell.

COUNTY ATTORNEY CALLS WITNESSES

Twelve Have Already Been Examined and Twenty More Are Held—Charge of Murder Creates Excitement.

LEAVENWORTH, Kan., April 13.—Alfred Alexander, father of Fred Alexander, the negro who was burned at the stake for the alleged assault and murder of Miss Carrie Forbes and for the assault on Miss Roth, has fled information with the county attorney against a number of those participating in the burning and asks for warrants for their arrest upon the charge of murder.

Before issuing the warrants the county attorney decided to examine witnesses under the law passed by the last state legislature. Ten or twelve witnesses have been examined. Twenty more witnesses are to be examined whether he will issue the warrants.

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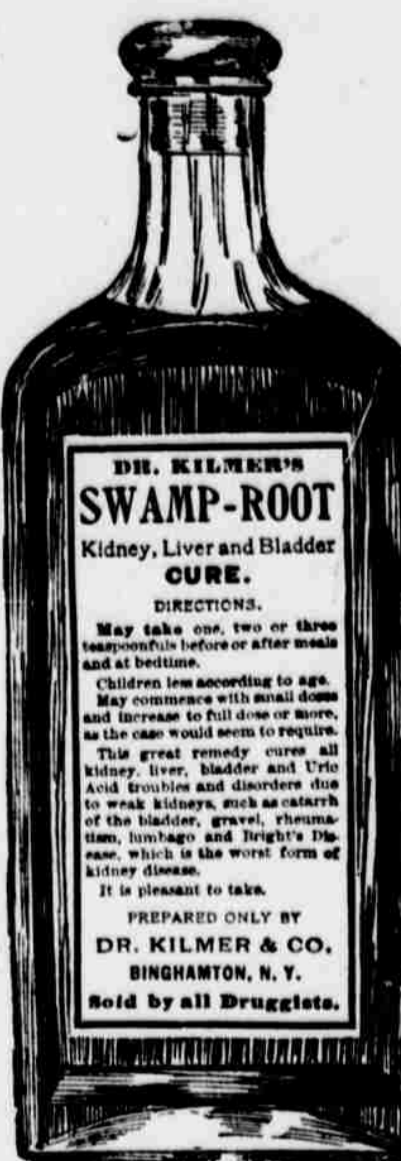
