

DEATH IN THUNDER STORM

Farmer Near Beatrice Struck by Lightning in a Corn Field.

CREIGHTON HOUSE DESTROYED BY BOL

Flash Fires Burn in Fremont and Hill Damages Gardens and Fruit—But All Welcome the Rain.

BEATRICE, Neb., May 5.—(Special Telegram)—Henry Hausjurgin, whose home was two miles northwest of Pickrell, was found dead late last evening in his corn field, where he was planting corn. His team came in from the field with the corn planter attached, an investigation was made and his body was found in the field with no marks of any kind whatever on his body except a slight singe upon his mustache. The supposition is that Mr. Hausjurgin was killed by lightning.

Garden truck were somewhat damaged by hail and fruit trees, which were filled with blossoms, were injured.

The rain continued nearly all last night and this forenoon, the total precipitation being nearly 2.5 inches. It will be a great help to pastures.

Edgar Drouth Terminates. EDGAR, Neb., May 5.—(Special)—This part of Nebraska was visited by a welcome rain yesterday afternoon and last night. The precipitation up to this morning amounted to two and a half inches. Farmers were becoming somewhat apprehensive of drought, on account of the unusually hot and windy weather for the last two weeks, but all fears are now dispelled, as the plentiful rain, just in time, practically assures a bountiful crop of wheat, which never looked so promising at this season of the year as it does now.

Growing Crops Benefited. NEBRASKA CITY, May 5.—(Special)—A heavy rain visited the metropolis yesterday afternoon and last night. The precipitation was nearly two inches. All growing crops, especially wheat and oats, will be greatly benefited. Good progress has been made with corn planting.

Morgan, began suit against Oteo county yesterday to recover \$5,000 on account of injuries to himself and team sustained by the falling of a bridge near Berlin, April 26. The plaintiff alleges that the bridge was defective in construction and was unsafe. He further alleges that his arm and ankle were broken, aside from severe internal injuries, as a result of the fall. The case will be tried at the September term of court.

Mrs. Kreille obtained a verdict of \$500 against the saloon keepers in district court for selling liquor to her husband, now in jail for counterfeiting, and the reamendment grows out of that suit. It is thought the board will grant licenses.

NEBRASKA CITY, May 5.—(Special)—The health of Hill Frampton, the colored man who shot his wife and daughter, Elizabeth Clark, February 17, is falling rapidly and it is doubtful if he will live to be tried for his crime at the September term of the district court. He is suffering from remorse and the fear that he is to pay the death penalty within a short time.
