been experienced in opening the sewers, but by forcing streams of water drawn from fire hydrants into the sewer openings have been made and in most cases the lines are now clear.

Some time ago Inspector Cook recommended to the council that flush tanks be provided at the head of all sanitary sewers in order to keep up a constant flushing Cook's idea is to fill these tanks with water from the city supply and attach an automatic contrivance which will flush the ewers a certain number of times a day.

These tanks, it is asserted, can be constructed for about \$50 each and connections with the water mains made. Not more than fifteen tanks will be needed at the present time and the cost will not amount to a great deal when the work accomplished is taken into consideration.

At the time the suggestion was made to the council by Inspector Cook the matter was passed, but since it has been discovered that the severs need attention the communication will most likely be taken up and acted upon as seen as the funds are

available. The N street sever should be extended from Ninetcenth street east to the river. This is an important question which has been put off by the council for a number of months. With warm weather coming on the open sewer from Nineteenth street east

will become a nuisance and complaints will commence to come in. Several damage suits are now pending against the city for maintaing this so-called nuisance and more will follow unless the authorities take steps to extend the sewer.

#### How Many Councilmen
