GREAT IS GARRY HERRMANN

Three-Year-Old Colt Beats Boney Boy at Hawthorne.

PROVES HIMSELF ONE OF THE GAMEST EVER

His Four-Year-Old Competitor Runs in Good Form and It is a Horse Race Clear to the Wire.

CHICAGO, May 28.—Garry Herrmann, the king of western three-year-olds, made his first appearance of the season today at Hawthorne and at least answered the question as to whether he is to be a factor in the American Derby. The answer was in the affirmative.

He was beaten by Strangeth, who this afternoon was defeated a dozen lengths. Garry Herrmann won by a comfortable margin, being the only starter. Garry Herrmann cut out the pace, with Boney Boy right at his heels. Strangeth was unable to keep up and dropped out of it at the half-mile pole.

Turning into the stretch Boney Boy made his challenge and it was a neck race. Herrmann responded magnificently, but despite his efforts the four-year-old got a neck in front. Woods drew his whip at first but it made no effect on the Derby colt, but at last the latter seemed to realize that something more was required, and with bull-dog courage he settled down, overtook Boney Boy and secured a good lead in front and kept it there to the finish.

Herrmann won the race on courage alone, and it is undoubtedly one of the gamest horses that ever lived. He was unquestionably short of condition and today's race should do him a great deal of good. He conceded Boney Boy twenty-two pounds, but was 7 to 10 favorite in the betting.
