FOR THE AMERICAN DERBY

Track and Horses Both Receiving Their Finishing Touches.

MANAGEMENT SANGUINE OF THE RESULTS

Notables are Arriving in Great Numbers and Chicago Evinces Substantial Interest Despite the Ban on Speculation.

CHICAGO, June 19.—Half a hundred men were at work today putting the Washington park race course in fit condition for the American Derby, which is to be run here next Saturday. Every one of the 1,000 stalls is occupied or engaged for horses to arrive tomorrow or Friday for the race.

Several of the Derby candidates were worked today. Tomorrow all of them will be given their final "prep" for the big race. The indications are that there will be at least a dozen starters in the Derby, of whom the following, with their weights and jockeys, respectively, are counted as "sure":

Terminus (Colburn) 122 Lody Schorr; His Eminence (Colburn) 127 Robert J. Miller; The Parader (Colburn) 127 Water Colburn; Sadie (Colburn) 127 J. J. Lattin; Outlander (Colburn) 127 J. J. Lattin; Six Shooter (Colburn) 127 J. J. Lattin.

By tomorrow most of the owners and trainers of the horses who are coming will have arrived. Among these are: Clarence Mackey, owner of His Eminence; J. Foxhall Keene, owner of Outlander; and Captain Brown of Pittsburg, owner of Garry Herrmann, who but for his unfortunate breaking down on the track, would have been a contender for Derby honors.

Management confident. The management is confident that the attendance on Saturday will eclipse the award made in 1892. "Nothing can possibly interfere with the Derby," said Secretary James Howard tonight. "It will be the greatest meeting ever held here and will draw the biggest crowd. The action of the courts in suppressing gambling at Harlem can have no effect on the Derby, for the reason that the club long ago decided not to tolerate open betting on the track, and we are anxious to be on a race. It would be difficult for anyone to stop them. As to transferring the event to Louisville, I can only say the matter has never been dignified by serious consideration. The American Derby is a cup of glory, and it is not to be given every evidence of being fast. We can stand rain tonight and Friday night, for that matter, and still be in the finest kind of shape."

The track officers for Derby day will be: John F. Moss, racing judge; Colonel S. Marshall Apperson, associate judge; Hugh E. Keogh, patrol judge; Richard Dwyer, starter; James Howard, secretary and steward of the Western Jockey club.

W. P. Schulte, president of the new American Derby club, declared today that he had come to Chicago to urge the Washington Park club to transfer its meeting, including the American Derby to be run next Saturday, to Louisville.

There is nothing probable in the suggestion that the Derby be transferred to Louisville. At best, with betting, Louisville could not give a bigger crowd for the Derby than 20,000, and Chicago, with betting barred, can easily outdo that record. I am here to attend the races, not to make transfer proposals.
