HOME COMING OF THE CONSUL

Delegation of Auburn Citizens Escorts...

STATE OFFICIALS JOIN IN THE GREETING

Prominent Politicians of Nebraska Are Present to Do Honor to Distinguished Citizen Back from His Duties Abroad.

In Auburn yesterday Church Howe was welcomed by his friends and neighbors back to the state of Nebraska...

In the morning a delegation of the citizens of Auburn headed by Peter Berlet arrived in Omaha...

Extensive preparations had been made for the reception of the returned consul at Auburn.

After arriving in the city Mr. Howe was escorted to his home by the reception committee...

"It is with pleasure," said Governor Savage, "that I am able to welcome to the state of Nebraska a citizen who has been so long and so distinguishedly away from home."

"As to those that mission has been filled no one who knows Church Howe can have any doubt."

"I have been acquainted with the subject of our meeting for a number of years. My impression of him was that he was a high type of a broad-minded, true, loyal American citizen."

"You will pardon me if I mention a circumstance which many of you will remember, proving that he has very keen perceptions of what I might call the qualification of looking into a grindstone just a little further than most of us."

Governor Savage related the incident of the days of 1890, when the republican state convention was presided over by Church Howe.

"The old ship is leaking, boys. Let every good man be placed at the pumps to save her."

"In years gone by," the governor resumed, "many of our consuls were appointed as a reward for some work done in some political campaign, with not a thought of their business qualifications."

Improvement in Consular Service. "In those days it was a rare sight to see the American flag floating from the masthead of any merchant ship or see American products in any part of the largest foreign markets."

"This subject might be continued indefinitely, but I beg pardon for having taken up your time, but, friend Howe, we are proud of you and of your work and gladly welcome you home."

At the conclusion of his speech Governor Savage grasped the hand of Mr. Howe and welcomed him on behalf of the people of Auburn to his former home.

Hon. J. Sterling Morton spoke on general matters with especial reference to the First congressional district. The afternoon ceremony closed with a response to all addresses by Church Howe on behalf of the people of Auburn to his former home.

This banquet outshone all similar affairs in the history of the city of Auburn. A special train conveyed invited guests from different parts of the First district.

There was a large delegation from Lincoln and another from Pawnee county. At the banquet toasts were responded to by the speakers of the afternoon and other friends of the returned citizen who could not be present at the afternoon reception.
