Spanish Captain Relates Story of Schley's Behavior at Santiago. REAR ADMIRAL'S LETTER AT DEPARTMENT

NEW YORK, July 31.—The Madrid representative of the Journal and Adviser has obtained an interview from Captain Diaz Moreno, who commanded the Cristobal Colon during the naval conflict of Santiago.

"All the American officers, without exception, did their duty in a certain of Santiago. So did we, though it is certain that we were 'assailed' by superiority of force. It is absurd and unwarranted to make any exception in the case of Admiral Schley."

"I have read in El Mundo Naval that this attack upon an honorable naval officer has a low political origin. The navy should be left out of politics."

"Admiral Sampson's own official report is evidence of the Brooklyn's active part and of Schley's competency and bravery. The adverse criticism is obviously a thoughtless, as a naval officer I deplore it, because the navy should be as sensitive as a woman about its honor."
