TESTS THE PACERS' METTLE

Six Heats in the 2:09 Race at Columbus

STACKER TAYLOR HAS HOT COMPANY

George Takes Two Firsts and Carmine Takes Another, but the Son of Captain Cook Finally Gets the Third.

COLUMBUS, O., July 31.—Perfect weather and the largest crowd of the week greeted the grand six-day performance at the Driving park this afternoon. Last night's rain put the track in excellent condition and all three heat winners in the 2:09 pace broke their records, as did Onward Silver, winner of the 2:12 trot.

The factors so far in the heat of the 2:09 pace, went to Stacker Taylor, who gave one of the greatest exhibitions ever seen at the track. George was a strong favorite over the other seven starters, selling for \$50 to \$30 for the field, with Carmine second choice. Stacker Taylor won the first heat in 2:08 1/2, lowering his record a first and a half. George took the next two heats, each in 2:06 1/2, reducing his mark from 2:09 to 2:06 1/2.

Onward Silver was a \$5 to \$30 favorite for the 2:12 trot, in which there were only four starters. He broke badly in each of the first two heats, which were won by George, but he took the third and fourth heat, reducing his record to 2:10 1/2 in the final mile.

Dr. Book, favorite in the 2:14 trot, took the first two heats, with Wauban half a length behind. He took the third and fourth heat, but Grace Onward drove him to a break forty yards from the wire and won the heat. Wauban led all the way in the fourth mile and the race was postponed until tomorrow. Results:

MAKE PHOTOGRAPHERS PAY

Effort Toward Consolidation of All Dry Plate Firms of the Country.

ONE MORE TRUST TO BE ADDED TO LIST

Two New York Manufacturers Trying to Get Larger Houses of America and Europe to Combine, with Capital of \$30,000,000.

ST. LOUIS, July 31.—The Post-Dispatch today says that negotiations for the consolidation of the leading photographic dry plate factories of the United States and Europe with a capital of \$30,000,000 is pending. Three of the companies concerned by the negotiations are St. Louis firms that turn out 80 per cent of the plates used in the United States. These firms are the G. Eastman Dry Plate Company, the M. A. Seed Company and the Hammer Company.

The men who are promoting the consolidation are George Eastman of the Eastman Kodak company of Rochester, N. Y., and Charles Abbott of the Aristo Manufacturing company of Jamestown, N. Y. They were in St. Louis last week and conferred with representatives of the three big local concerns, Gustave Cramer, president of the Cramer company, says they made a definite proposition to absorb his company. The Seed company has had many propositions for consolidation, taking stock in the consolidated enterprise in payment for its plant, but its position is not to lose control of its business except by sale for cash. President L. F. Hammer of the Hammer company says that he has heard talk of a consolidation, but that nothing definite has been done.

The statement of the plan of the proposed consolidation was made to the Post-Dispatch today by Mr. Cramer. "Negotiations for a consolidation have been pending for some time, but until the visit of Messrs. Eastman and Abbott to St. Louis, last week nothing definite had been done. "While the consolidation concerns, if the deal should go through, will have control of the dry plate output of the world, I hardly think it will have the power to name its own prices if it desires to do so. Many small companies will not be absorbed, and they will turn out enough plates to keep the market alive. The proposed capital of the great company is \$30,000,000."
