WEIMERS' CURVES PROVE TOO STRONG

Center Fielding by Genins and Ketcham Are Prominent Features—Dispute as to Double Headed Engagement.

Dira revenge for Tuesday's defeat was enjoyed by the Kansas City boys in their second game with the Omahas, for they won in a walk yesterday by the hopeless score of 8 to 0.

To attribute this result to Pitcher Gordon alone would be unfair, for not a single run could his team make earn, or even steal. They were simply powerless to hit Weimer's curves. Not till the seventh inning did they get a hit, and then only a single that did not count. Then in the ninth two more safe ones came, but they were not sufficient to coax a score.

Meanwhile the visitors were pegging away at Gordon for hits in just the right places to convert fair base hits into tallies. They did not start till the third, but then three single hits on top of a bad error by Calhoun and a man hit by Gordon netted three scores. In the next inning Hartman made another with his home run over right field fence, and there was no more hope for Omaha.

Beautiful center fielding by Genins and Ketcham was prominent features of the game. Then Letcher caught a high fly in shallow right and threw to second in time to nab Ketcham, who had left the bag too far. But Weimer's weird curves were what interested people most.

Weaver in Evidence.

In the fifth inning the new catcher, Weaver, went in to show what he could do behind the bat, and made a great hit with the crowd. His throw to second base was superb in speed, direction and height, and the ball seems to leave his hand on those occasions before he has well caught it. Indeed, Captain Stewart was not able to get to the bag in time, and muffed the ball, missing a putout once on that account.

And no one holds the opinion that he did not hit Weimer, when the batters of the team, Fleming, Genins, Calhoun, Letcher, Stewart—all left the game with a zero batting average for the day.

Kansas City plays here again today, and in relation to the doubleheader which was to come off, Manager Rourke has a word to say. He shows a letter from President Hickey saying that Kansas City is to play one doubleheader while here, and thus make up the game forfeited by Omaha, to Kansas City down there on Sunday, August 25. Omaha refused to play at that time because the Missourians ran in balls on them which were not regulation nor official.

Later, however, this game forfeit was annulled, and the game declared off. Hence the ordered repetition here. But now Kansas City refuses flatly to play, and it seems that no power will be able to compel them to do so.
