DEMAND FOR IRRIGATION

Farmers' National Congress Will Urge Claim Upon Congress. WESTERN LANDS ENTITLED TO AID.

National Resources the Proper and Only Means for Accomplishing This Great Good to Whole Country.

SIoux FALLS, S. D., Oct. 3.—At today's session of the Farmers' National Congress, Dr. J. W. Heaton of the South Dakota Agricultural college, in a paper on "Farmers' Opportunities," discussed the necessity of government aid for the reclamation of the arid lands of the west.

He said that the general government had received \$90,000,000 from the sale of western lands since 1875 and thought it not unreasonable to ask that \$15,000,000 a year be expended for ten years in the reclamation of lands capable of supporting a population equal to the present population of the United States.

He declared that the states could not deal with the problem and that nothing could be done until the general government made an appropriation, and he urged the congress to press the matter to the attention of congress.

The discussion developed the probability that a resolution would be adopted tomorrow in favor of national legislation to aid the irrigation of arid lands of the west.

At the afternoon session Prof. H. W. Cameron of Kansas delivered an address on "Soil Culture in the Semi-Arid West." Hon. John H. Brown of Indiana discussed "Ancient American Forests."

At tonight's session "The American Girl and the Home" was ably presented by Miss Bertha Dahl of Iowa. Hon. M. F. Coffey of South Dakota delivered a carefully prepared address on "Farm Home and Life."

Homesteads Are in Demand. CHAMBERLAIN, S. D., Oct. 3.—(Special)—The report of business transacted by the local United States land office during the quarter ending October 1 is the most favorable in many years.

The report of original homestead entries shows a decided increase over the record of the preceding quarter, which indicates that the heavy influx of new settlers which set in a year ago is still increasing.

This is the detailed statement: Original homestead filings, 218, covering 29,190 acres; final homestead proofs, 139, acquiring title to 21,925 acres; sixty-eight commuted homestead proofs, providing title to 10,620 acres; six final timber culture proofs, covering 550 acres; making a grand total of 431 entries, either original or perfected, representing 61,195 acres, handled for the quarter.

Shoulder Shattered by Shot. HURON, S. D., Oct. 3.—(Special)—Dell Coursey, 19 years of age, living near Virgil, was badly wounded by the accidental discharge of a gun Monday evening.

He was riding in a hayrack with a shotgun in the rack. The jolting of the hayrack caused the gun to fall between the plants in the bottom of the rack. Coursey stooped to catch the gun as it fell, when it was discharged, the entire load of shot taking effect in young Coursey's left shoulder.

A large part of the bone was shot away. The physicians fear he will not recover.
