the Killing of C. L. Wilt-

WICHITA, Kan., Dec. 4 .- A prisoner in the Sedgwick county jail at Wichita, known by the name of "Shin", has confessed hat he, in company with Clyde Moore and 'Shorty" McFarland, killed C. L. Wilterger, a wealthy farmer in Coley county, last April. Clyde Moore is now on trial for

the murder of Wiltberger. In the trial today of Clyde Moore the state introduced testimony in regard to footprints found leading from the scene of the murder. Detective Cal Ferguson testified that he had examined the footprints and that they corresponded exactly with young Moore's shoes. The revolver with which the murder is supposed to have been committed was introduced and ideatified as one that belonged to Moore.
