PAYMASTER STRUCK GERMAN

Identity of Aged Civilian Assaulted by Richworth Nicholson Established. PRESIDENT APPROVES HAWAIIAN LOAN Minister Conger and State Department Center Constantly Over Terms of Proposed Treaty with China Soon to Be Signed.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24.—At the Navy department today the fact was learned that the "aged civilian" whom Assistant Paymaster Richworth Nicholson recently attacked at a public ball at Chee Foo, China, was the German consul at that place. Nicholson, who was said to be drunk at the time, was convicted by court martial and sentenced to a reduction of five numbers in grade, Rear Admiral Evans, commanding the Asiatic station, in his report of findings, severely arraigned the court for the inadequate sentence imposed.

Hawaiian Bonds Approved. The president has approved the Hawaiian bond issue of \$1,250,000. That amount of territorial indebtedness is authorized under the Hawaiian loan act to be incurred during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1904. The Hawaiian legislature authorized the raising of \$2,400,000 during the biennial period ending June 30, 1905, but under the terms of the organic act the president cannot approve a loan beyond one year, in order to guard against the possible failure of the revenues to meet the indebtedness. The financial condition of Hawaii is shown by the official figures accompanying the bond issue proposition. The ad valorem assets of the territory for the fiscal year 1902 were \$122,910,805, the loan now authorized being 1 per cent of this amount. The total expenses of the territory for one year cannot exceed 7 per cent of the total assessed valuation and this 7 per cent is \$60,756.

Consider Chinese Treaty. Minister Conger is in constant communication with the State department over the final details of the commercial treaty with China which is to be signed October 8. Nothing has developed to indicate that the signatures of Prince Ching and Mr. Conger will not be attached on the day stipulated. Authorities here believe the treaty will mean much for the future of American trade in the celestial empire. In addition to the provisions for opening ports, it contains stipulations for trade intercourse, which, it is claimed, make it a better treaty than that negotiated with China by Great Britain.

Officers' Cases Go to President. The action of the president is required in the cases of seven officers who were convicted by court-martial and sentenced to dismissal, and in two of the cases, imprisonment. The officers are Lieutenants Hamilton, Knud Knudson, Thomas E. Marquis, Hamilton Foley and B. L. Rucker, and Cadets James G. Steer and William A. Ganol, the two latter from Pennsylvania. The cases will be submitted to the president on his return to Washington.

No Word from Russian Outbreak. Nothing has been received from the American charge at St. Petersburg regarding the recent anti-semitic rioting at Gomel. An action which the State department may take will be confined strictly to the matter of protecting American interests.

Grand Jury Resumes Work. The federal grand jury today resumed the consideration of the postoffice cases, but adjourned without reporting any indictments.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24.—Commissioner Richards of the general land office today named November 10, at 9 a. m., as the date of the opening to settlement of the 76,000 acres of Chippewa lands in Minnesota, recently segregated from the timberland of that reservation.
