#### COUNT TALKS OF HIS WOES

Bays He Intended No Forgery and Would Have Repaid Rome Mi'ler.

RETURNS TO OMAHA WITH CHIEF DUNN

Mells Officers that His Sister is Coming from France with Five Hundred Rubles, Ris Aflowance.

"f'am not feeling very well this morning and I don't care to talk. When my slater arrives from Aix La Baine, France, which will be in about three weeks, then I will make you a statement." said the Count de Agrnett at police station yesterday, having just arrived from Albany, N. Y., under guard of Calef Detective Dung, who had scured his return through regulation papers granted by Governor Odell.

'In America I am a plain American citimen," observed the count. "What I am in my own country, Russia, matters not. In New York, where I wrote checks galore, I am well known, and though sometimes I overdrew my bank account, I never was suspected of trying to beat anyone and never was arrested. When my sister comes I will get my allowance of 500 rubles, amounting to \$309 in American money (I get an allowance, you know, every three months-this to Captain Haze, who interposed a question regarding where he got

"My, my, it is all a mystery," the count continued, "how I ever came to give those two checks to Mr. Miller to sign. I meant him no wrong. I would have paid him back every cent, too. I was coming herewas seiling cigars-good ones, too, and making \$10 a day to pay him with. I have had much trouble on my mind; you don't know how much. I was sent out of Russia by my father and a reconciliation has never been effected. We could have been reconciled in 1900, but he wanted me to give up my trade as a barber and I am an artist at my trade. I shaved President McKinley sonce. That was at the Palace hotel in Denver. I had \$450 with which to pay Mr. Mil-Ber when I was arrested at Rochester, How did I get rid of it?"

And here the count related a tale of how he had been duped by a lawyer in Rochester and how the lawyer had got all his coin and then, not satisfied, had appropriated all his stock of cigars and some of his personal effects, even down to his most precious razor.

#### Full of Nonsense and Dope.

"This man filled my head full of nonsense and it was pretty full of morphine at the time," the count went on, "and made me think I could win out and not have to come back here. He caused me to spend all my

"I was arrested at Rochester by McGuire. He asked me if I was the count and I said, 'If you want the count I guess the jig is

"Well, what did McGuire say to that?" maked Captain Haze.

"He said I was a bunco man and I told him I didn't understand that kind of language. Then he asked me if I ever passed green goods. I told him no."

The count admitted that his father was titled man of large estate and influence in his balliwick in Russia. He intimated his father was a real count, but avoided saying whether he was or not. He claims to be an ex-Philipping soldier and says he did battle In Luzon as a member of the Twenty-secand Pennsylvania regiment.

The count's trouble here consists in the alleged forgery of two \$10 checks to which e procured the signature of Rome Miller, for whom he was working as a barber. He fied from Omaha to Rochester, where he was apprehended. Chief Dunn went to chester and thence with the count to sured his return from Governor Odell. The time for his arraignment is not set.


