ROCK ISLAND TO CUT TIME

Will introduce New Schedule Sunday Increasing Speed of Omaha-Denver Trains.

A new schedule will go into effect on the Rock Island on Sunday. This will only affect trains west of the Missouri river and several important changes are contemplated. The running time of the present No. 6 is to be cut down by about three hours between Omaha and Denver. This train is now due here at 5:35 in the evening and it is proposed to have it leave Denver about three hours later, making up the time along the way, and arriving in Omaha at the same time as it does at present. Change in the time of No. 5 is also being considered and several other trains will also be affected by the new winter schedule.

Notes from Army Headquarters. Two days' travel rations were shipped to the Iowa National Guards from the United States depot commissary, for use enroute to the Fort Riley army maneuvers.

Proposals have been advertised for by the chief quartermaster of the Department of the Missouri for the removal of the old sheds on the triangular piece of property recently acquired by the government between the quartermaster's depot and the railroads in this city. The buildings are practically useless old structures and are to be removed at once, in order that the work of building the addition to the quartermaster's depot may be begun at an early date as practicable. The title to the property has been perfected and the sale formally consummated to the United States.
