

CLEVELAND WINS SERIES

American Club Takes the Majority of the Ohio Championship Games.

LAST GAME ENDED IN THE DARKNESS

Spectators Make Demonstration, but Empire Insists on Nine Innings and Calls on Policemen for Assistance.

CINCINNATI, Oct. 11.—The Cleveland American club won the series from the Cincinnati National club today by taking the second of the double header, making it stand six to four for the Ohio championship.

Ragan was a puzzle up to the eighth inning in the second game and the Cleveland team could do nothing with his curves. It was so dark after the seventh inning that the players could hardly see the ball and this was responsible for Cleveland winning.
