May Be Good Enough for Some, but Cannto Stay in Omaha Library.

WITHDRAWN AND SEVERELY ARRAIGNED

Miss Tobitt Passes Sentence on Author as Well as Book and Calls it Factor of Immorality.

"The One Woman; a Story of Modern Utopia," has been withdrawn from circulation in the Omaha Public library. This happened Tuesday after the book had been accessible to patrons for six weeks, or

from the time published. Miss Edith Tobitt, librarian, says the novel is "coarse, gross, crude and with a tendency towards the immoral."

Despite these flaws it has been the most popular volume of fiction in the liberary this year. More calls have been received for it than for any other book. It has been read with avidity by all classes. No protests have been registered officially and Miss Tobitt says, frankly, that she has cast out the book because she does not believe it is worthy of a place on the shelves from the standpoint of literature. sethetics or ethics. Briefly and bluntly she has no use for "The One Woman," which was written by Thomas Dixon jr. author of "The Leopard's Spots."

"Had I read the book before it was purchased it never would have been in circulation in this library. The novel seems to me so crude and melodramatic that I can find no reason why it should be considered even commonplace literature. It seems to teach no lesson, although the effort to moralize is evident-at any rate it falls to impress in this regard. Parts that are professedly intensely serious are funny. The pardon incident and the myriad difficulties that surround it have the ring of the genuine 'ten-twenty-and-thirty-cent' productions

On the whole I think "The Que Woman' is coarse, in fact about the coarsest thing I remember reading. In my opinion the book does not make immorality especially detestable, and yet it deals with grossly immoral sub-jects. 
