WALTER CAMP HAS NEW SET OF PLAYS

Yale Expects to Try a Number of Innovations for First Time in Public, While Princeton is Silent.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Nov. 13.—Yale and Princeton will meet on the gridiron here tomorrow. It is a meeting of the giants, for admittedly the two teams have shown the best work of the season this year.

Walter Camp has worked out a set of plays that take advantage of the fine points of the season's new rules, and it is said that Yale will play a varied and dashing style tomorrow.

The lineup will probably be: Captain Rafferty, left end; Kinney, left tackle; Blomcher, left guard; Roorback, center; Blomcher, right guard; Hogan, right tackle; Shuehlin, right end; Rockwell, quarterback; Mitchell, left halfback; Metcalf, right halfback; and Farmer, fullback.

So far there has been little betting, as the Princeton supporters are demanding too great odds.

MURDERS ANDREW H. GREEN

Negro Fatally Shoots the Father of Greater New York.

ILLUSTRIOUS VICTIM DIES INSTANTLY. Police Arrest the Assailant, Cornelius M. Williams, After the Encounter at Thirty-Ninth Street and Park Avenue.

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—Andrew Haswell Green, the "father of Greater New York," and comptroller from 1871 to 1876, was shot several times this afternoon at Thirty-ninth street and Park avenue by Cornelius M. Williams (colored), who has been arrested. Mr. Green died almost instantly.

Five shots were fired at Mr. Green, four of which took effect. Williams was taken to the police station, where he said he had shot Mr. Green because Mr. Green kept in his employ a negro girl, to whom Williams had been paying attention. Williams had been a furnace tender at the house where Mr. Green was staying and was standing in the doorway with his hand behind him when Mr. Williams came up and assaulted him. He immediately fired five times, four of the shots striking Mr. Green in the face. After being taken to the police station, Williams talked irrationally and the police believe him to be insane.

When Mayor Low heard of Mr. Green's death, he ordered the flag on the city hall to be placed at half-mast, and said: "The killing of Mr. Green is a public calamity. He was one of the most useful of our citizens and his services to New York will long be remembered."

Mr. Green was prominent many years in New York as a lawyer, and in 1866 originated the plan for the creation of Greater New York as carried out in 1897. He originated also the plan which resulted in the consolidation of Astor, Lenox and Tilden libraries in the New York public library and was trustee of the same. He was executor of the S. J. Tilden, William B. Ogden and other large estates and was prominent in many societies and organizations. He was born in Worcester, Mass., in 1820 and resided at 91 Park avenue.

Mis-spelled words next week. CASE NOW IN JURY'S HANDS. Fate of Missouri Politicians Charged with Fraud Will Be Known Saturday.

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 13.—The naturalization fraud case in which John P. Dolan, Thomas E. Barrett and Policeman Frank Garrett are on trial for alleged naturalization frauds went to the jury early tonight and court adjourned until tomorrow, so a verdict will not be possible tonight. Federal Judge Adams' instructions to the jury were very brief. Other indictments on naturalization fraud charges are still pending against Barrett and Dolan.
