The True Story of the First Explorer of the West Published by Barnes.

TRANSLATED FROM ORIGINAL SPANISH

Several Volumes of Poems Part One

by Badger-Josephine Caroline Sawyer's Latest Book First of All is a Love Story.

The true story of the first explorer of the west is now presented to the public in "The Journey of Coronado from Mexico to the Buffalo Plains of Texas, Kansas and Nebraska," translated from the original journals and edited by George Parker Winship. This remarkable history told at first hand, which has been pronounced of more thrilling interest than any historical novel, has just been published by A. S. Barnes & Co. in their notable Trail Makers series under the consulting editorship of Prof. J. B. McMaster. While Coronado's Journey is of general historical interest, its publication will be peculiarly welcome in the west. The east has had John Smith and Henry Hudson; the south, De Soto, and now the story of the first explorer of the west is brought within the reach of general readers. The Coronado is uniform with A. S. Barnes & Co.'s popular edition of the Journals of Lewis and Clark.

"Poem Pictures," by Mrs. Laura Chao Downing, is a collection of poems of wide versatility. The subjects dealt with are numerous and the poems are grouped as far as possible under those headings. They show great originality of thought and expression, which taken with the attractive binding forms a very pleasing book. "Far from the Stone Streets" is the suggestive title of a little book of poems from the pens of Henry and Helen Chadwick. Many of the poems in this collection have already been published and highly commended by John G. Whittier and others in a position to judge of their merit. The book is tastefully bound in green with gilt lettering. "Quarry Slaves" is the title of a little drama by Les Byrnes, the scene of which is laid in a Hellian underground quarry, some years after the Athenian expedition against Syracuse. "Love Knoweth Best" is the title of a small collection of poems by William Garvin Hume, in which the author tries to impress the fact that while many things that occur in this world seem to be misfortunes "Love Knoweth Best." These volumes are published by Richard Badger.

"All's Fair in Love," by Josephine Caroline Sawyer, author of "Every Inch a King." Like its predecessor Miss Sawyer's new book is first of all a love story. A girl who is betrothed to one of two inseparable friends loves the other, and while knowing that she is loved devotedly by both she contrives to keep her secret so well that it is unguessed by either of them until the climax of the story is reached. The scene is laid on the Scottish border in the warlike days of old, and the persons are from the families of Douglas, Percy and Neville, among whom the slightest indiscretion on the part of the maid would have brought on a bloody war. It is a story that for audacity of plot and tenderness of interest can hardly be surpassed. It is beautifully illustrated in color. Published by Dodd, Mead & Co.

"The Mystic Mid-Region," the deserts of the southwest, by Arthur J. Burdick. The author makes the deserts the most interesting field imaginable for exploration and study. There are so many obstacles to research, however, that they are comparatively unknown, even to the inhabitants of the regions bordering. In "The Mid-Region" the author has given an excellent chronicle of both his misadventures and his triumphs, and his adventures and his mysteries and his revelations. The text is appropriately illustrated with fifty-four illustrations. Published by Putnam.

"The Pastime of Eternity," by Beatrice Demarest Lloyd. New York is the scene of this novel and a man of wealth and leisure for the central figure. His life through his temperament and unfortunate marriage has fallen into a tragic gulf of isolation. His resurrection is accomplished through the love of two women, whose relations to him and to each other constitute the important element in the plot of a dramatic and emotional story. Published by Scribner.

"The House in the Woods," by Arthur Henry, author of "An Island Cabin." This is the story of a return to nature, the building of a mountain home and the conquest of the soul. It is a nature book with human interest, and in addition to the charm of the country life and the wood lore pictures in these pages, the story thrills with the humanity which the author has found and depicted with true insight. He tells how the forest was cleared and a house was built; how a home was made and the wild things of the mountains yielded place to their domesticated brethren. He pictures the prowess of the mountaineers, the deeds of the woodmen and the influences which made themselves felt in a brighter life for the people of the woods. The beauty of nature in the mountains, the joy of existing out of doors and the success, not of mere country living, but also of country fellowship, are brilliantly pictured in this delightful story of a new life in a Catalik mountain home. "The Test," by Mary Tepper Wright. While book is a strong novel of contemporary American life by a writer whose early short stories, "A True," "Haggards of the Rock" and others showed her the possessor of an individual and original talent. In "The Test" Mrs. Wright is at her best, and the situations of the story are such as to call forth all her exceptional literary art. Published by Scribner.

"The Old Furniture Book," with a sketch of past days and ways, by N. Hudson Moore, author of "The Old China Book." In these days of "antiques" proud owners of an old piece of furniture will feel an increased affection for it. If they can give an approximate date and assign it to a maker or a country. Hornung, author of "The Amateur Cracksman," "Raffles," etc., is a story of the Australian goldfields, the Crimean war and of shipwrecks and adventure, in which a lovely lady and her lover and a villain and other villains perform their usual parts. "The Price of Youth," by Margery Williams. Fan Tacker, the heroine, is one of those not altogether lovely girls one often meets in real life as well as fiction. "Letters from a Son to His Self-Made Father," by Charles Eustace Merriam. These letters are the replies to letters from a self-made merchant to his son. "Around the World with a King," by William N. Armstrong, a member of the cabinet of Kalakaua, the last king of Hawaii. King Kalakaua was the first sovereign "to put a girle around the world." The frontispiece is a portrait of King Kalakaua, and there are also numerous other portraits of Oriental sovereigns. It is entertainingly written and makes very interesting reading. "Bog Trooping for Orchids," by Grace Greylock Niles, with beautifully colored illustrations from nature. Miss Niles is an enthusiastic bog-trotter and she describes in a very charming way plant life in the swamps of the Hoosac valley, a region extending over parts of Vermont, New York and Massachusetts. The work is profusely illustrated with forty-eight half-tones and twenty-four colored plates from photographs taken of the orchids in their native haunts. Readers will be surprised at the number and rare beauty of these native flowers, which are little known owing to the inaccessibility of their habitat. The author has observed not only the orchids but all other flowers of interest which grow in the region traversed. Published by G. P. Putnam's Sons.

The July issue of the Outlook contains a special article on the national republican convention at Chicago, written by Francis E. Leupp, perhaps the best known and certainly one of the ablest—if not the ablest—of the Washington correspondents for New York papers. The article is accompanied by portraits of the republican candidates for the presidency and vice presidency, and in the same issue an elaborate editorial discusses the policy and platform of the republican party. The Harpers are reprinting two capital books, which are interesting in connection with the war. One is Poulney Bigelow's "The Borderland of Caesar and Kaiser," notes from both sides of the Russian frontier. The book tells some interesting things about the Russian soldier and is illustrated by Frederic Remington. The other is Edward S.
