

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Quickening of Interest Doubtless Due to Suspension in Trade. Opening Strong and Scale Advances. Sales by Holders of July Grain Cause Reaction and Lower Prices Follow the Brief Bull.

OMAHA, July 1, 1904. Today was the last for the principal markets of the country before Tuesday, which probably accounts for the quickening of interest.

There were no contract deliveries in wheat and oats at Chicago, but 5,000 bushels of corn were made at Omaha today. The fact that there seem to be no deliveries at Chicago, and the pressure probably saved figures from a serious break.

Kansas City reports that conditions in Kansas are serious. More rains have delayed harvest to a great degree and it is thought that 75,000,000 bushels of the yield there will be 75,000,000 bushels at the close. This considerably less than was expected a week ago.

There was an absence today of the big demand for corn which has been a feature of the local market for the last week and sellers outnumbered buyers on the floor today. Receipts of corn from the two coars grain seem inclined to cover until later in the month.
