

TRAIN KILLS MAN AND WIFE

Union Pacific Colorado Special Hurl Couple from Tracks Dead.

HUSBAND IS ONE OF THE STRIKERS

He and Woman Are Picking Coal from the Roadbed When Train Strikes Them, Death Ensuing Instantly.

M. Pellen, a packing house striker, and wife were struck by Union Pacific passenger train No. 12, the Colorado special, at a point about half a mile east of Avery, about three and a half miles south of South Omaha, at 8:10 yesterday morning and instantly killed.

Mrs. Pellen had been along the tracks near Avery picking up coal and her husband was on his way to meet her. Pellen was on the east side of the new iron bridge over Mud creek, while his wife was on the west side coming towards him.

Those who witnessed the accident say that Mrs. Pellen saw her husband struck by the train and seemed to be spellbound. As she ran she did not make any effort to jump to the side of the track. When the pilot of the engine struck her she was thrown probably 70 feet and landed near the fence along the right-of-way.

People Rush to Scene. In a few moments those residing in the vicinity were on the scene. Sheets were procured from neighboring houses and the badly mutilated bodies were covered, pending the arrival of the coroner.

A message was sent from Avery to Dr. Armstrong, the coroner, at Papillion, and he arrived shortly before 10 o'clock. After viewing the remains the coroner telephoned to South Omaha and notified Undertaker G. H. Brewer to take charge of the bodies.

Pellen was about 50 years of age and his wife about 45. He had been employed as a laborer in one of the packing houses at South Omaha but was on strike. The couple lived in a small settlement between Avery and the South Omaha city limits.

Arrangements for the funeral will not be made until after the inquest Friday. Mr. and Mrs. Pellen had lived at their late home for about three years. Where they came from no one in the vicinity seemed to know.
