Ruling of Four Judges in Favor of Abraham L. Reed.

FIGHT OVER EAST OMAHA PROPERTY

District Court Verdict Confirms that of County Court and Case Will Now Be Again Appealed.

Yesterday afternoon Judge Hartlett, presiding in the district court handed down his decision in the appeal of John R. Drexel, Anthony J. Drexel, George M. Drexel, James W. Paul, Jr., surviving executors and sole legatees and devisees of Anthony J. Drexel, deceased, from the judgment of the county court...
