CONVEYS ITS ACTION IN A LETTER

Dr. Herring, Conley and E. C. Smith Want to Publish Letter, but Are Restrained by Others from Such Conduct.

Against the votes of several members the Ministerial union yesterday refused to cooperate with Edward Rosewater's proposed plan of civic reform.

Considerable discussion was indulged in at the meeting in the Young Men's Christian association rooms when it came time for action on the letter from Edward Rosewater proposing certain reforms in municipal government.

The adoption of the report was put to a vote and five feeble voices answered "yes." Rev. E. Comble Smith called attention to this fact, when a rising vote was taken, resulting in a large affirmative majority.

Rev. H. C. Herring then moved that after Mr. Rosewater had been notified of the union's action by letter the letter be given to the press.
