Set Aside by Most Business and Official Men for Celebrating Christmas.

MONDAY WILL BE HOLIDAY

TWO BIG STORES WILL REMAIN OPEN

City and County and Federal Offices Will Keep Their Doors Closed and Do Not Work.

Jmaha will be a closed city Monday. That is, with a few notable exceptions the business houses of the metropolis will keep their doors closed during the day which has been appointed as the substitute for the Sunday Christman. The Commercial club some time ago made inquiry among the jobbers, manufacturers, commission houses and retaliers, and the general opinion seemed to be the business places should close for the day.

Among the big retail houses, Thomas Kilpatrick & Co., Thompson, Beiden & Co., the Bennett stores and most of the others will be closed for the entire day. On the other hand, J. L. Brandels & Sons, and Hayden Bros. will be open the whole day. We have had an exceptional holiday trade," said Robert Cowell of Kilpatrick's. "Several days ago we passed the mark of our total for December trade in preceding years-the rest is all velvet. The weather has been so exceptionally fine shoppers have been able to be out every day, and the shops are getting the advantage. feel we can afford to close."

All the jobbing houses practically have signified their intention of closing for Mon day. They have no particular incentive for keeping open, as no belated Christmas shopper will be wanting to rush in and buy a hurrled gift to mail to some one who had unexpectedly sent a present. The manufacturing houses also will generally observe the day and the operatives will have a chance to take a little extra recreation. The banks all have up their notices of closing Monday.

The county offices, with the exception of a the county treasurer, and all the city offices will be closed. The offices in the headquarters of the Union Pacific and the Burlington will be closed the entire day and the city ticket offices will be shut up at noon.

#### Uncle Sam Takes Rest.

While there is no federal statute that recognizes a holiday, the federal offices will generally be closed Monday and no public business will be tranacted. This applies to the offices of the United States circuit court, district court, custodian's office, weather bureau, commissioner's court, pension examiner's and immigrant inspector's offices and internal revenue departments. There will be but two carrier deliveries from the postoffice Monday morning and one delivery in the residence district. The office will close at 10:30 a. m. for the day. The money order office will not be opened at all Monday. Christmas day the postoffice will be open as usual on Sundays, from 11:30 a. m. to 12:30, noon.

At the army building Monday will be recognized as a holiday and the building will be closed for public business all day. The same rule will be observed on the Monday following, New Year's day,




