CHICAGO, Jan. 27.—The local police assert that two men being held in connection with the killing of an Italian in Kansas City are members of the Mafia of Chicago and were sent here to commit murder. Agostino Caldorini was killed here last night and today Joseph Bellaboni and Frank Rossi, Italians, were arrested. The police are holding them on the theory that they were sent here from Chicago to kill the slayer of Joseph Shereto, a member of the society who was murdered in this city on December 7 last. It is asserted that Caldorini was mistaken for Michael Basili, another Italian, who was suspected of the murder of Shereto. Shereto was a barber who had been in Chicago for some time and had been in the city for some time.
