Yesterday afternoon the area of the city physicians were taken to the institution for Feeble Minded Youth by the wives of the local physicians.

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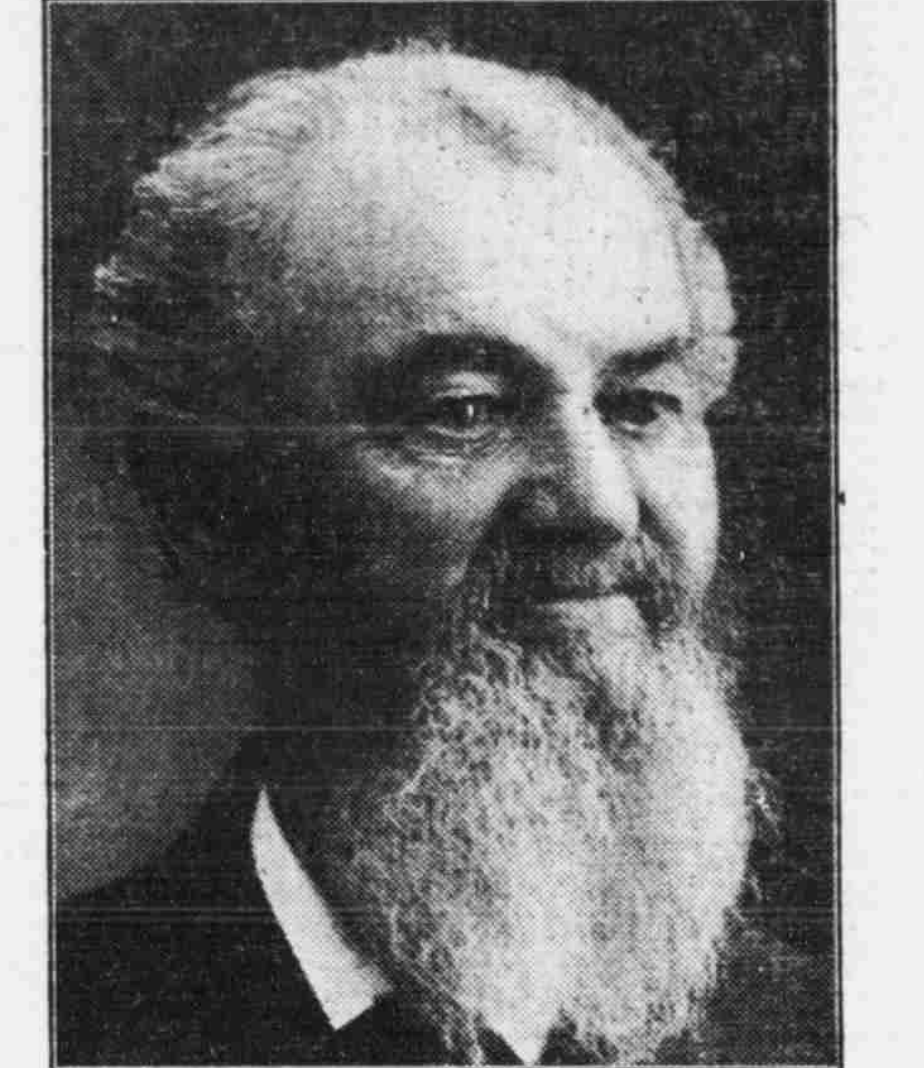

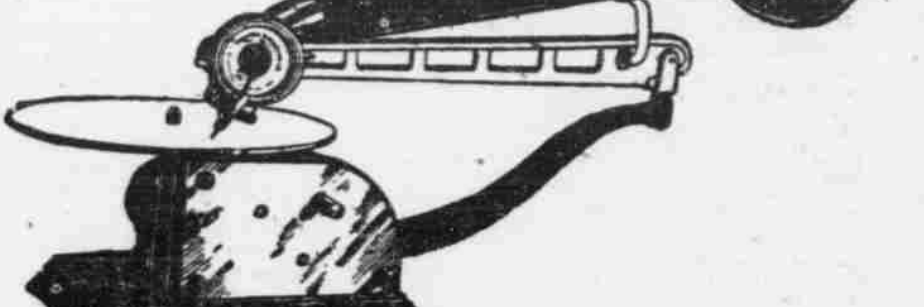
