

WATER BOARD CASE PUT OFF

Motion for Temporary Injunction Must Wait Judge Mungler's Return.

ORDER WILL STILL REMAIN IN FORCE

Proofs Cannot All Be Submitted Before June 30, and Final Hearing Will Come After that Date.

Owing to the fact that Judge Mungler left the city Saturday afternoon for a week's absence in Indiana, the hearing on the motion for a temporary injunction to restrain the Water board and city of Omaha from enforcing the reduction of the water rate has been continued for twenty days. The hearing was set for Monday.

In the meanwhile the temporary restraining order will continue in force. Attorneys C. C. Wright and John L. Webster, for the Water board have filed a motion in the United States circuit court asking the water company to be required to produce their books in court in order that their actual income may be ascertained and as to whether the reduction of rates ordered by the Water board are unfair and unjust. The books are to be produced on June 18, and the matter upon the application for the motion will be heard before Judge Mungler June 15.

TILDEN DENIES THE STORY

Physician of Insane Board Does Not Remember Meeting Husband of Demented Woman.

Mrs. W. E. Tompkins, the paralyzed and demented woman who was removed from her home at 1516 Marcy street, Thursday afternoon at the instigation of neighbors, will remain at the county hospital indefinitely, according to the present belief of the authorities interested in the case. The Board of Insane Commissioners do not believe the case to be one coming under the jurisdiction of that body.

Referring to the statement made Friday by Mr. Tompkins, who said he called on Dr. J. Tilden of the insane board regarding an investigation of his wife's mental condition, Dr. Tilden says: "I have no recollection of having met Mr. Tompkins, and even had I met him, I did not tell him to go home, that he was insane himself, which statement Tompkins declares I said to him."

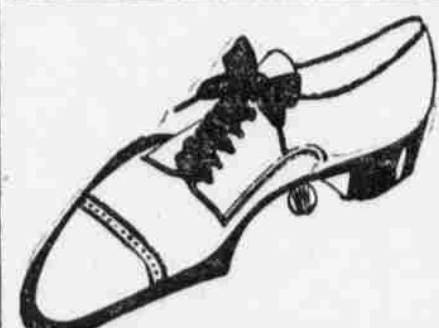
