Omaha Grabs the Last of the Series from Denver's Clutches.

HEAVY HITTING WINS FOR HOME TEAM

Both Pitchers Batted Hard, but the Champions Get Their Safeties Closer in Order and Take the Rubber.

In a ninth inning finish that was a corker Omaha won the third and odd game of the series from Denver by the score of 5 to 4 at 10 p.m. Monday afternoon before the grandstand well filled with women, who had taken advantage of the fact that it was ladies' day.

A passed ball advanced Dolan to third and he scored on the throw-in of Doctor Welch's out to Old Sport. Martin walked and Schipke's single sent him to second and he scored a minute later on Lawler's single through the piteer. Freeze got a rap in the ribs and Sanders knocked an easy one to first.

Both of the pitchers were hit hard, but Sanders had the better of the argument. He did not pass a man and except in the last inning kept his hits well scattered. Carter made a nice record at the bat, as he is credited with two hits in two times at bat; both the other times that he faced the pitcher he sacrificed.
