Plants Set Out by First President Used in Celebration.

WASHINGTON'S BIRTHDAY EVENTS Many Organizations of Omaha Will Commemorate the Day with Patriotic Song and Speech and Exercises.

Flowers grown from cuttings set out by George and Martha Washington at Mount Vernon will be used in Omaha in celebrating the anniversary of the first president of the United States.

One of the unique celebrations of Washington's birthday will be held by the social science department of the Omaha Woman's club Monday afternoon and for this occasion flowers from Mount Vernon green houses will be used in decoration.

Mrs. C. F. Manderson is one of the board of regents of the Mount Vernon Ladies' association of the union, and will address the department on the work of that organization in restoring and maintaining the home of Washington.

Friday morning General Manderson telegraphed the superintendent of the green houses at Mount Vernon asking for the immediate shipment of such varieties of flowers as would withstand the trip.
