Travis Lines Up at the Fifteenth

Green and Quits

Three Times Little Winner of Golf Honors Out of It at Brookline to Anderson.

BROOKLINE, Mass., Sept. 14.—An entirely new amateur golf champion is hidden among the eight players who survived a double round of the Country Club's annual tournament, the first of which was held at Brookline today. Travis of Garden City, three times little winner of the United States Golf association, packed up his clubs today at the fifteenth green, where John G. Anderson of the Woodland Golf club, a former Massachusetts champion, eliminated him by a score of 3 up and 3 to play after a match in which Travis was down in the lead.

There were too many traps on the course for my game," said Travis. The other seven victors of the day went to W. H. Wilder of Yonkers, Lowell, Mass., who was the victor in the match with Fred Herreshoff of Oakwood, New York; Charles Evans, Jr., of Edgewater, N. Y.; Warren K. Wood of Homewood, Chicago; W. H. Tuckerman of Stockbridge, Mass.; and W. H. Tuckerman of Stockbridge, Mass.

The evening eight will meet in the order named tomorrow. All have won various district, state and minor association titles, but none has captured a national title. The eight will play a match tomorrow between Herreshoff and Evans. The defeat of Travis and the brilliant playing of Herreshoff and Evans were the events of the day. Travis seemed to have a fondness for all traps and hazards, and as there are something like four-score of such impediments between the first tee and the eighteenth green, he never succeeded in overhauling Anderson's accurate game. He also developed a surprising streak of poor putting, and just before the sixth and eighth holes he pushed into the cup. Anderson was four up on the home-ward journey on trap work, so that he had a single hole lead at the lunch hour.

In the afternoon Travis put his second handicap first hole into the race, and followed it by a short bird. Anderson saved mistakes on the second hole by a ten-foot put. Travis sliced into the rough on the third, but both played the fourth to perfection. Anderson topped on the fifth hole, but Travis made a hole-in-one. On the eighth Anderson sent his second over the green into the rough and repeated it on the ninth, where the match was squared for the first time.

The short tenth was halved and then Travis put his hole-in-one. He sent his second shot for the eleventh green into the rough, dove into a trap on the twelfth, missed a short putt on the thirteenth and on the fourteenth, after driving into the marl pit, he poked up his ball. The match was then halved. Travis hooked his tee shot into the woods. Herreshoff continued today in beating Whittemore, the brilliant work that won him the gold medal in yesterday's qualifying round. Little "Eck" Evans, the Chicago star, continued to lead in the afternoon before he settled matters on the seventh green. Evans played the morning round in 72 and the afternoon in 71. Tuckerman, who was defeated by Herreshoff, is expected to be a runner.

Ten Million Aliens

Arrive in United States Since 1901

Forty Subdivisions in Classification

Show Some Very Instructive Facts in Detail.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—Since 1901 2,718,812 aliens have arrived in the United States. The races represented have been classified in forty subdivisions by the statisticians of the immigrant bureau. The southern Italians lead all in numbers with a total of 1,351,368, with the Jews second at 776,383. Polish home-seekers were third in number with 573,000. The miscellaneous immigrants for which no appropriate place could be found in these subdivisions numbered 16,772. The Pacific islanders were the least in number. Only 61 of them have immigrated.

The average amount of money possessed by each alien at landing averages \$22. The Spanish Americans were richest, averaging \$104 each, and the Koreans were poorest, with only \$7 each. Pacific islanders averaged \$3 and Japanese \$11. The Jews are among the poorest, their average being \$12.

Englishman Takes Aviation Honors

Harvard White Champion of the First Purse and Three Other Firsts.

BOSTON, Mass., Sept. 14.—Claude Gramme-White of England, flying a Farman biplane and a Beriot monoplane, both equipped with a French motor, proved himself the champion of the first annual Harvard-Boston air meet at the close of the nine days competition tonight, having won the blue ribbon event of the meet, the Boston Globe prize of \$10,000 for the harrier flight to Boston Light and return. He took altogether four first places and three seconds in different events, winning \$22,100 in prize money. No person was injured during the meet and there was less than \$500 damage to property, including the president of the meet, by the president.
