IS UP TO THE CITY COUNCIL Sheldon Says There Are No Funds

Upon Which the Council Could Possibly Draw to Make Up the Deficiency.

The last connection between the city payroll and Dr. Young, the veterinarian from whom the council took away the job of milk inspector, has been severed by Health Commissioner Connell, who notified the council Tuesday night that Dr. Young and nine other inspectors would be laid off October 1 unless some provision is made to pay them from other funds. Dr. Young formerly received \$150 a month from the city, but half of his income went with

the work of inspecting dairies. The others stated for removal, all of them receiving 55 a month, are Sanitary Inspectors Charles Burntr, Frank J. Fixa, H. B. Milder, Gust Hartman, Walter Johnson. The funds for Dr. Connell's department were estimated by the finance committee of the council without any consultation with He was allowed \$22,500 after asking for \$28,500. There is now \$2,110 left to cover a three-months payroll of more than \$5,000. After he had been allowed \$6,000 less than he asked for he appointed several inspectors more than were customary and their positions have had only a nine-month's life. With the ten men gone, he will have left, own services, costing \$166.67 a month; Dr. Langdon, inspector of contagious diseases; Dr. Langfeld, bacteriologist; Esau Fleishman, meat inspector; E. J. 
