OGDEN TO ENTER NEW FIELD

Plun to Co-Operate with Farmers in

Building Storage Reservoir. COULD BUILD DAM FOR \$1,000,000

Foothill Acresse Sufficient for Thansnad Grehards Are Today Waste

Sands, but Would Produce. If Properly Watered.

OGDEN, Ctab. Feb. 21.-(Special.)-Odgen City, as a corporation, is seeking to enter a new field in municipal ownership. The ity authorities contemplate asking the Urah legislature, new la session, to make possible the co-operation of city and farmers in the building of a storage reservoir at the head waters of Ogden river, to cost approximately \$1,000,000. For that simt a dam could be built on Cobble creek, twenty miles east of this city, and main canals and laterals constructed, capable of aupplying with water, in the summer months, double the acreage now under quitivation is

There are three available sites for erroirs, as follows;

At Magple, storing 27.000 acre-feet of Water at a cost of MTEGHE.

At Cobble cheek, storing 25,280 scre-feet of water at a cost of \$600,000. On the Right Bland fork, moring 5.505

norw-feet of water at a cost of EM,000. The most feasible undertaking is that at Cabble creek. It would open to reclamation at least 30,000 acres of rich land and attract to Ogden part of the great stream of home seekers that annually goes through this gateway to the extreme west on the

Touch of Water Needed.

The foothills east, north and south of this city, with an acreage for 1,000 orchards, where homes for 10,000 people could be created, are today waste lands thu but require the touch of water to be made as productive as the most highly cultivated footbill country of the Rhine.

Ogden City sees an opportunity to belp establish vineyards, peach and apple orthards, truck gardens and tonuato fields, and to environ (taelf with countless prosperous farts homes, and Opdes is to step out of the beaten path of municipalities to accum plish this high purpose. If the city andseeds, this part of Utah will be thoroughly converted to the enlarged idea of public ownership of public utilities, even including the flow of the inland rivers.

The Davis and Weber Counfles Canal ompany has resumed operations on its waterway to the south of Ogden, and concrete gangs are once more at work lining the canal and making the sides and floor of the great ditch impervious to seepage. This converting of dirt embankments and a sandy bottom into an aqueduct of nument is one of the most important briration innovations in the United States. The saving to be made by stopping the less of water by seepage and the greater carrying capacity of the ditch to be abained by the transformation will point the way for other large irrigation comcanies to conserve their water supply.

Competitive Lighting System. A franchise has been granted by Ogden City to the Merchants Electric Light and Power company and plans are being prepared for an extensive electric system tition with that of the Utah Light and Rallway company, which heretofore has had an exclusive field.

The new company is financed by local espitalists and expenditures aggregating half a million dollars are to be made before the competitive system reaches its full development. Much of this money is o be expended in and around Ouden within the next two or three years. Power plants are to be established, a distributing system is to be constructed and business blocks

This invasion of the local field by an insectric company promises to be a material factor in Ogden's expansion. New Variety of Potate.

The farmers in the Plain City district, to the west of Ogden, have what is locally known as the "mortgage lifter." It is a potato of a new variety, which, when properly planted, well cultivated and harvested, will lift a burden from any owner of a farm. Last season a number of the agriculturists grew the "mortgage lifters," and one of them, Albert Maw, says that from an acre of ground he marketed give worth of potatoes, obtaining \$1.5 to \$1.75 per 100 pounds. Early Ohios, from the same soil, brought \$135 per acre.

Three acres of tomatoes, cultivated on the Maw farm, returned a revenue of \$272. This land is irrigated and is in a district, that a few years ago attracted but little attention. The possibilities of the oil were not appreciated until after the development of the sugar beet industry in Weber




