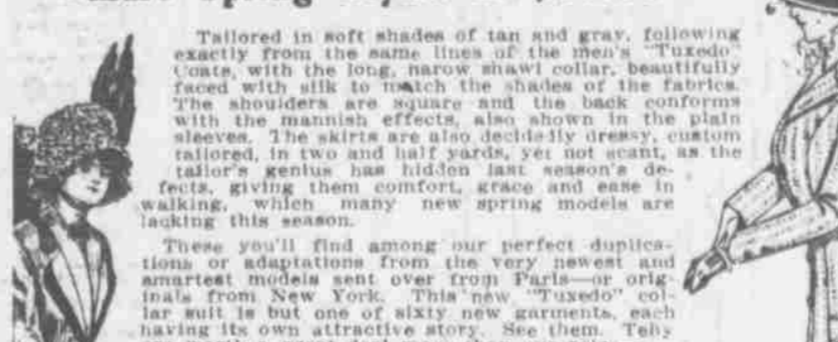

ILLINOIS CENTRAL TO BUILD

Work on New Freight Depot Will Start Immediately.
ASK FOR ORDER OF VACATION
Site includes Portion of Chicago Street and Two Alleys—Construction Work Begins When Plans Are Complete.

Preparation for the erection of a \$200,000 freight depot for the Illinois Central is under way. Work on the depot will begin at once. The road will in a few days make application to the city council for the closing of Chicago street from Eleventh to Twelfth streets and for the two alleys north and south of Chicago.
The plans for the new depot are still incomplete but it will be built on the latest plan, consisting of two freight houses with platforms between, running from Davenport street to Cass and from Twelfth to a little below Eleventh. The terminal and switching yards will be extensive.
John H. Webster, attorney for and local agent of the Illinois Central, is making the application for the closing of the street, and there will probably be no difficulty as the street is backed by the old Illinois Central depot and various railroad tracks just below Eleventh and no traffic goes along it.
Work on the depot will begin sometime this spring, as soon as the road is able to draw its plans and let the contract. Only one of the freight houses will be built this year, and when the business grows in future the second will be built.

Blind Soldier Will Marry Housekeeper Who Saved His Life

Hobart Bascombe to Wed Mrs. Mary L. Duncan in His Seventy-First Year.

In the lonesome blindness of old age, Hobart Bascombe will marry the woman who saved him from tottering over a precipice to his death.
The marriage ceremony will be performed Thursday night by Ed Leeson, justice of the peace, an old friend of the groom.
The bride of the aged man is Mrs. Mary L. Duncan, a widow, who has been keeping house for Mr. Bascombe since his divorce five years ago. Mrs. Duncan saved the life of her aged sweetheart on a summer outing in the Colorado mountains two years ago when he ventured too near the edge of a chasm.
Bascombe receives the highest pension paid to a veteran of the civil war in Nebraska. He is blind as the result of exposure in battle. He carried the colors of the Union forces beyond the rebel lines at the battle of Pittsburg Landing.

PORTIA'S PLEA WINS VERDICT

Lawyer Recites from Shakespeare and Gets Big Judgment.
CHATTEL LOAN AGENT LOSES
Man Who Sues for House Rent Fails to Collect—Defendant Allowed Seven Hundred Dollars—New Trial Asked.

Portia's touching mercy plea had not the slightest effect upon "the starved and wolfish desires" of Shylock, according to one William Shakespeare; however, a suit in the district court may be given a new trial on the ground that the quoting of that passage from Shakespeare unduly prejudiced a jury to return a verdict in favor of the defendant and in excess of the limit fixed by the court.
The case is one of Charles C. Burdage, a chattel loan broker, against Adolphus C. Warthen. The loan broker sued Warthen for \$6 house rent. In reply the defendant filed a cross-petition stating that he was buying the house on the installment plan, not paying rent on it, and asking judgment against Burdage.
In his argument Tuesday afternoon Arthur C. Pannoset, attorney for the defense, applied the case of the pound of flesh and recited Portia's plea with such effect that the jury returned in a short time with a verdict of \$200 in favor of the defendant. The court had fixed the amount for which the jury could find for the defendant at \$28.60.
M. O. Cunningham, Burdage's attorney, filed a motion for a new trial Wednesday in which he made the quotation the chief ground, alleging that it affected the jury so that it returned the verdict under prejudice and passion.
