Kenyon Declared Caucus Nominee. Iowa Republicans Who Enter Conference - Make Him Choice to Succeed Dolliver.

DES MOINES, Ia., March 30 - At a caucus of sixty out of the 104 republican members of the Iowa legislature tonight, Judge W. S. Kenyon was nominated as the republican party candidate for United States senator to succeed Senator Dolliver.

Of the forty-four absentees fifteen have voted for Kenyon hitherto. Sixty-four members signed the caucus call, but the republicans who have been voting for Judge H. E. Deemer did not sign the call or participate in the caucus.

Representative John Jacobs of Calhoun county presided and Judge Charles Nicholas was secretary of the caucus, which transacted no other business.

Today's joint ballot stood: Deemer, 56; Kenyon, 83; Porter, 38; Judge C. G. Lee, 11; paired, 1; absent, 7; necessary to elect, 74.

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GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Bulls Are Disheartened and No Change is in Sight.

CASH PRICES ON THE DECLINE

Corn Situation Listless in the Face of Light Movement - Shipping Demand for Grain is Inactive.

OMAHA, March 30, 1911. The weather map shows light snow in the northwest with generally clear weather over the winter wheat. Liquidation has been severe, causing sharp declines in prices today.

There is absolutely no change in the general situation and the cash trade shows no signs of improvement. Corn is disheartened and outside of temporary liquidation conditions in the market there is nothing to give any sustained advance.

Receipts of corn are very light and in face of the light movement cash prices are declining and shipping demand is not active. The corn trade is in a position where it is on a supply and demand basis with no condition affecting the new crop are to be considered.

The severe break yesterday and some uncertainty in the market due to reports that the start started shortly to buying and the result was a little reaction in what values were in sympathy with wheat and values held steady to firm, while cash prices were a little lower.

Primary market receipts were 27,000 bushels, against 25,000 bushels the previous day. Receipts last year were 47,000 bushels and shipments of 157,000 bushels.

Primary corn receipts were 30,000 bushels and shipments were 40,000 bushels. Clearances were 30,000 bushels of corn, of which wheat and flour equal to 15,000 bushels.
