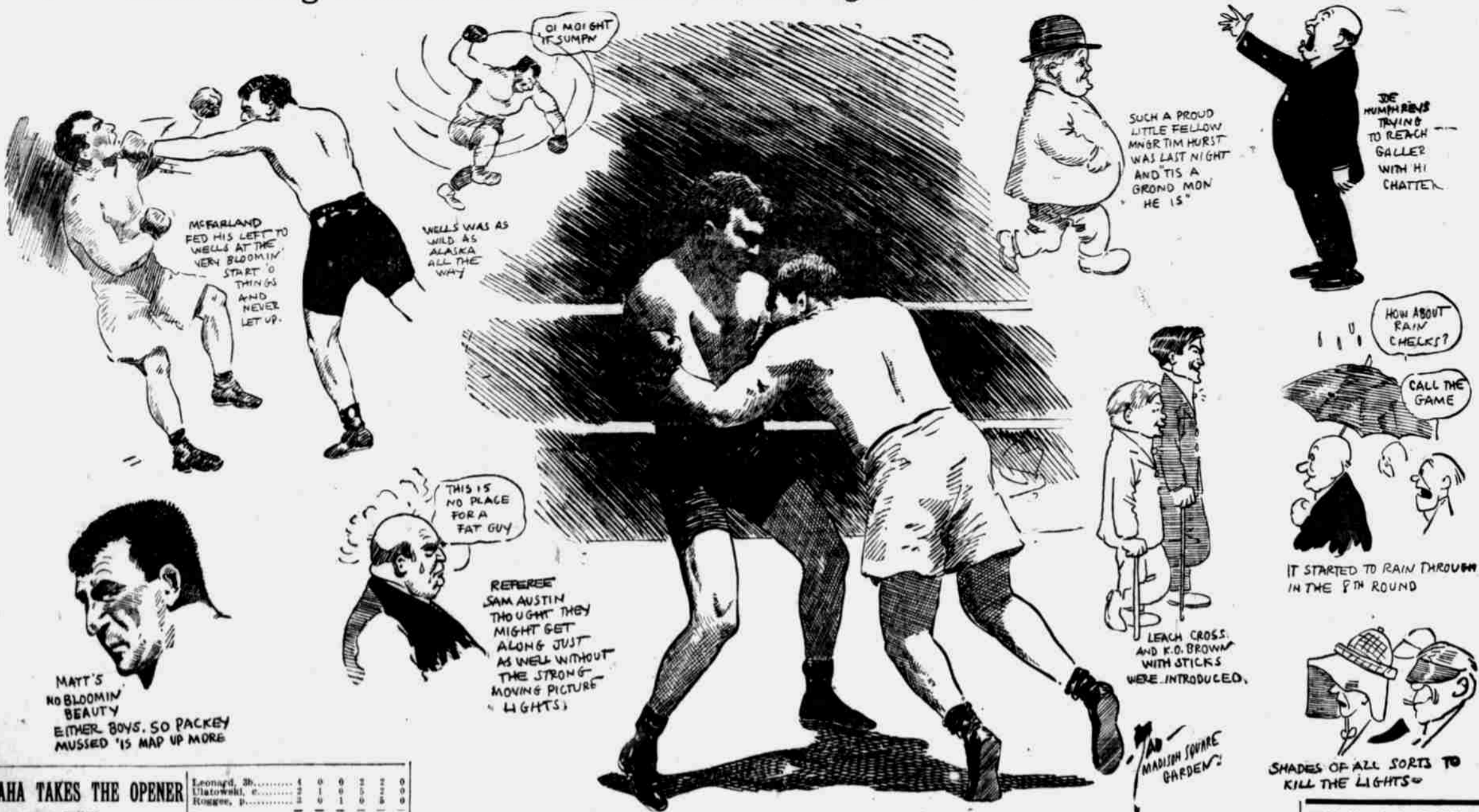

Rourke's Men Win from Des Moines by Score of Four to One.

TIMELY HITS IS WHAT COUNTS

Pa Hill Put in a New Catcher, but He is Sent to the Bench Rather Early in the Game.

Mark Hall's masterful pitching beat Des Moines yesterday afternoon in the first game of the series. Timely hitting by Pa's boys brought the Rourkes the long end of a 4 to 1 score.

Hill was almost invincible and had Des Moines eating out of his hand for the first seven innings, but then he let down just long enough for the Iowa bunch to snare a tally. In the first five innings not a run was made off Mark's delivery.
