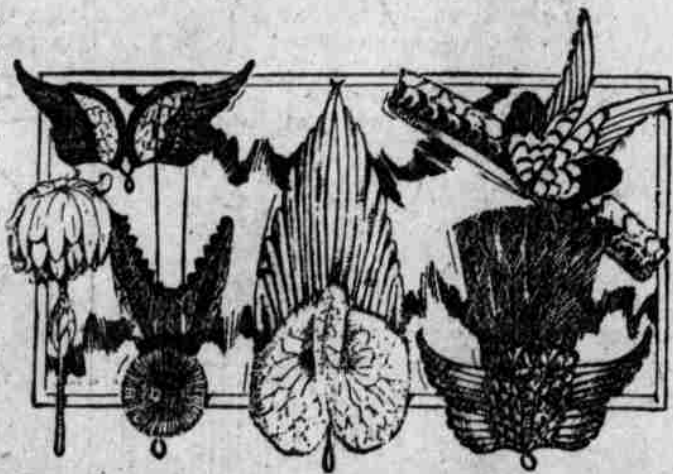

### PROMOTER SUES FOR BIG FEE

Chicago Man Asks \$800,000 from Nebraska Power Company.

### CASE ON TRIAL NEXT SPRING

Omaha Company to File Answer by October 14 and the Case Will Then be Heard by Judge Munger in April.

The Nebraska Power company was made defendant in a suit for \$800,000 filed in the federal court yesterday by J. H. Spears of Chicago, who claims that amount due him as a fee for closing a deal between the power company and the Amburns Hydraulic company of Boston.

Mr. Spears in his petition claims that he made a deal with H. E. Babcock, president of the power company, to get backing for the Nebraska company in furthering a water project in Platte, Howard and other Nebraska counties. He says he was to receive for pay \$100,000 face value of the capital stock of the company and \$40,000 in bonds at the face value and such an additional amount of the capital stock for a fee as is customary in such cases.

Mr. Spears, further claims, in his petition, that on April 21, 1909, he closed a deal with the Amburns Hydraulic company of Boston, Mass., whereby the Nebraska Power company was to receive a stipulated sum of money for furthering the project. A deal was made between Mr. Babcock and W. S. Cox of the Massachusetts company.

Payment is Defeated.

In his petition Mr. Spears asks that in default of the payment of the \$100,000 face value of the stock and the \$40,000 in bonds at the face value that the Nebraska Power company be compelled to pay him the customary fee which in such cases is 8 per cent of the capital stock of the company. In this case the capital stock of the company is \$12,000,000 and 8 per cent is \$960,000, which amount he asks the court to order the Nebraska Power company to pay him.

Mr. Babcock is out of the city at the present time and his office help knew nothing about the case when approached by The Bee. The Nebraska Power company will have until October 14 in which to file an answer to the petition. The case will not come up for trial until the April term of the federal court.

### Obstructing Signs May Be Removed from the Streets

Police Commissioner Ryder introduced a resolution, at the meeting of the city council yesterday prohibiting the erection or maintenance of signs three feet beyond the lot line. The ordinance was placed on its first reading and will be considered by the council at its next regular meeting.

Commissioner Ryder says East Farnam and Twelfth streets have been blocked to traffic by signs, display cases and other things placed on or above the walks by merchants.

The ordinance provides a fine of \$100 for violations. It specifies that electric signs more than four feet and three inches in width, "exclusive of ornamental design," shall not be erected.

Resolutions regretting the death of Chief Douglas were read at the council meeting Monday and a copy of the resolutions, which were drawn by a special committee from the council, will be sent to Mrs. Donahue.

The mayor of Sheeley invited the commissioners and the city clerk to an entertainment in Sheeleytown next Tuesday.

The ordinance prohibiting the establishment of new brick yards in the city limits, but giving the present yards permission to expand, was passed.

A resolution granting the Missouri Pacific railroad permission to lay a track on Boyd street passed by a vote of four to three, McGovern, Hummel and Withnell objecting.
