ANSWERS FROM FAR AND NEAR

Replies to Ak-Sar-Ben's Invitations Have Been Received from Many Parts of the Entire World.

October 5 to 10 will be home-coming time for all former Omaha people who have wandered far away from the old haunts of Nebraska's metropolis and have found employment and vocation else-This home-coming week was planned elaborately some six months ago, and the most detailed efforts were made to get circulare and invitations to all who were formerly Omaha people who are now in other lands.

Now as they come in for Ak-Sar-Ben and call at the information bureau, 1519 Howard street, they will be asked to register their names if they were formerly Omaha people. This will give the organization some tab on them, so that entertainment and special arrangements. can be made for them during the week as the occasion may develop.

Sent Many Invitations. Seat Many Invitations and circulars that thousand invitations and circulars that were sent to fermer Omahe & Sepas on this home coming affair. The bureau of publicitly worked with Ak-Sar-Ben on the matter for months. Through the active and eplendid co-operation of the lodges, fraternities and other organizations in the city, large lists of former Omaha. people and their present addresses were accumulated. These were poured into the Ak-Sar-Ben office day after day. Finally they were classified alphabetically and catalogued in card catalogues. From this list the letters of invitations were sent out to all parts of the world, for the former Omahans for one reason and another have been taken far from their native land. Thousands were sent out to Nebrasks and neighboring states. All Over the World.

On the other hand many hundreds went to foreign lands where traveling jobs and positions as special representatives of one concern and another have taken many former Omaha people. Thus many letters went to Europe, Asia and the Philippines, as many Omaha people are employed there under the United States government.

Replies were received from England, Japan, Phillipines, parts of Asia and many parts of Europe and South America. Great numbers are expected during the home coming week, and the only thing that is puzzling the Ak-Sar-Ben authorities is the matter of getting them together. The registration at the information bureau will catch many, but doubtless will not catch all. Arrangements will be made, however, as the week goes on, for the special entertainment of these


