Corn made only a temporary dip in response to the setback shown in wheat. Wet weather, threatening to delay receipts, was partly responsible for the strength of the market and so also was a tendency to even up trades in anticipation of the government crop report. The Washinston estimate, which arrived just after the close, proved, however, to be more bearish than had been expected. Oats reflected in a moderate way the renewal of a liberal demand from the soaboard. It was said that one purchase from France amounted to 400,600 bushels. Barge receipts of hogs at western centers weakened the provisions market. Buying on the part of packers, though, had a steadying effect after the decline.
