GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET
Dardanelles Key to Wheat Price—
 Longs Principal Sellers, with Quotations Dropping.
CORN AND OATS BOTH LOWER
 Close watch is being kept on conditions surrounding the possible opening of the Dardanelles. With those straits open to vessels there would be an outpouring of grain that would at least for a time change the world's markets from strong to declining ones. Russia has many millions of bushels of cheap wheat and barley, that not only producers and warehousemen are anxious to get on, but the bankers of that country are demanding its sale.
 The wheat market was a big affair yesterday, with long principal sellers. Prices at one time were off as much as 10c, but they were later recovered. This was retained late on reported takings of 130 boatloads of wheat by exporters, and in addition to this selling, Chicago shorts were sold, which took from which 100 bushels were sold to exporters and 100,000, to millers. The early break was on reports that three of the forts of the Dardanelles had been demolished by bombardment of the allies' warships, and that had been evacuated by the Turks. This led to enormous selling of long wheat, which had previously been held, and on the fact that it was time for a break, following such long continued advances.
 Corn and oats were both lower under an increase in offerings and lack of buying power. Speculation in both these grains were fairly active, but corn continued under a bearish position, and wheat is little hope at present for any price changes.
 The hog news was bearish and provisions ruled weak throughout the day. The weakness in grain was also a drawback to provisions.
 Hard winter wheat was 1/2c to 1/4c lower.
 Corn was unchanged to 1/4c lower.
 Oats were 1/2c to 1/4c higher.
 Clearances were: Wheat and flour equal to 100 bushels, corn, 250,000 bushels; oats, 600 bushels.
 Liverpool close: Wheat, not quoted; corn, 10c higher; flour, 1/2c higher.
 Primary wheat receipts were 512,000 bushels and shipments 1,200,000 bushels.
