Rate Increase from Omaha Postponed

The proposed increase in freight rates on furniture to Omaha from Chicago and points west, is not to go into effect April I, as planned by the railroads. The Interstate Commerce commission has decided to hold up the advanced schedule until June 29. This was done when the commission received a vigorous protest against the advance from the Associated Retailers of Omaha, Secretary J. W. Metcalfe of the Associated Retailers received a letter this morning from Secretary McGinty of the Commerce commission, conveying this information. In the meantime the local furniture men will prepare their case to go before the commission to ask for a permanent suspension of the proposed new schedule.

Wheat Drops to Law Price of the Year

A cable report that 11,600,000 bushels of Siberian wheat is in storage at Viadivostock, ready to be shipped to the war zone of Europe as soon as an opening is made through the Dardenelles, drove wheat down three to 4 cents per bushel and the Omaha market quickly followed the lead, prices here dropping to \$1.45 per bushel, the lowest of the year. Oats were off % of a cent, selling at 140542 cents per bushel. Corn receipts were thirty-two cars, and oats, twenty-five cars.


