Five Attractions Visit the Various Towns of the State During Week.

BIG ROAD SHOW ONE OF THEM

The work of the University Week association of the University of Nebraska during the last month has done much to advertise that institution. During the spring holidays five attractions made up of the major student activities of the school were sent to David City, Seward and Cozuela. The attractions included the military band of thirty members, the glee club of twenty-four, the dramatic club with twenty members, a road show with thirty young men and women and two faculty lecturers.

The organization of the University Week association and the work of preparing the schedules and programs is credited to the members of the Innocents, an honorary senior society of the university. Last year the band made a very successful tour of the state, and this spring plans were made by the Innocents to organize several attractions and send them out over the state. In order to carry out the work more successfully it was decided to form a permanent association which would make extensive week a yearly affair. The authorities were consulted and a committee of the Innocents was appointed to draw up a constitution and by-laws. At a meeting of the Innocents, Black Masques and faculty members, a permanent organization was perfected. The following were elected as members of the executive committee: Homer G. Hewitt, Russell F. Clarke and Frank S. Perkins, from the Innocents; Marguerite Farley, Gladys West and Lorena Dixby, from the Black Masques; Guy Reed, Dean Mary Graham and Prof. R. D. Scott, from the faculty. T. C. Williams was appointed by the chancellor as permanent secretary of the organization. He is an excellent member of the committee. At a meeting of the executive committee Russell F. Clarke was selected as president, Homer G. Hewitt senior manager and Earle Lane junior manager.

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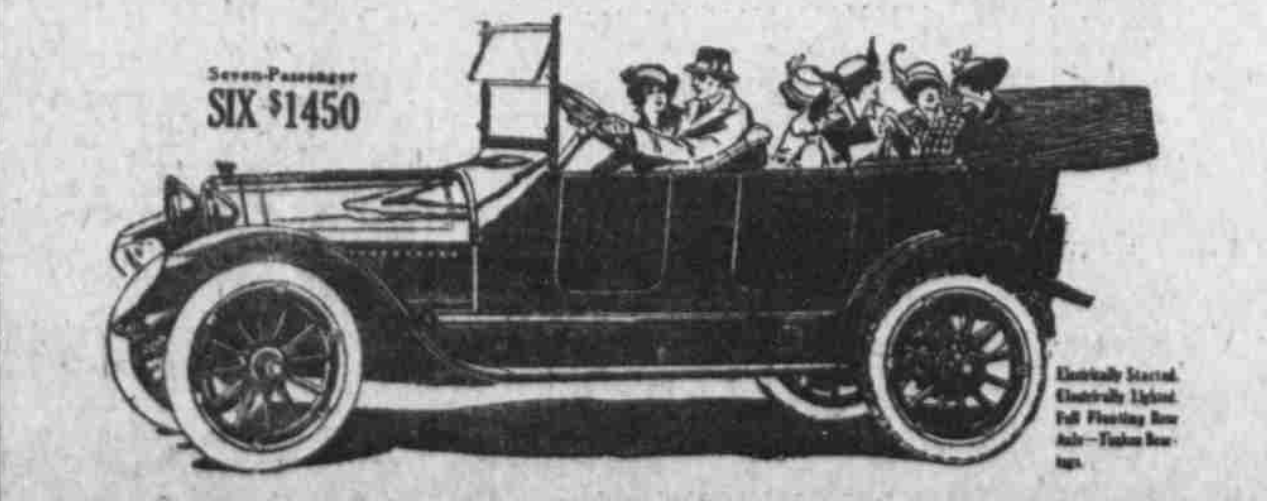
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
