Wife No. 1 Files Bigamy Charges

Jake Gendelman, alias Max Jacobs, of Omaha, who is accused of having two wives, and who for two years has been a fugitive, has been arrested in Schenectady, N. Y., according to information received by County Attorney Magney. An information charging bigamy and requisition papers were prepared in the county attorney's office.

Mrs. Mary Gendelman, wife No. 1, whom Gendelman married in Russia, in November, 1909, signed the information. Omaha charitable organizations, which have been assisting Mrs. Gendelman and her small child since her arrival in Omaha in 1913, have been instrumental in pushing a search for Gendelman, nationwide in its scope.

On March 4, 1911, the information charges, Gendelman married Miss Anna Brodski in Omaha, and she is now said to be with him in Schenectady.
