OMAHA LOSES THE OPENER TO SIOUX

Hernie Doyle Holds Rourke to Six Widely Scattered Hits.

FINAL SCORE IS SIX TO ONE

SIOUX CITY, Ia., Aug. 31.—(Special Telegram.)—Manager Harry Ganser was unable to pitch on Ganser day because of a sore arm, but Hernie Doyle, who substituted for Lemars' marvel, had an easy time with Pa Rourke's athletes and the champions topped the opening game of the series from Omaha, 6 to 1.

The Indians did not want long to get started and put the game in the refrigerator in the opening frame. After Cooney had whiffed at three, Cosgrove dropped one into the brink for a pair of bags. Callahan was safe on an infield hit, Cosgrove going to the corner. Lejeune tapped an easy one to Blodgett, who threw Cosgrove out at the plate. Watson singled to right center and Callahan raced home, to be followed a few minutes later by Lejeune and Watson, who tallied on Henning's single to right.

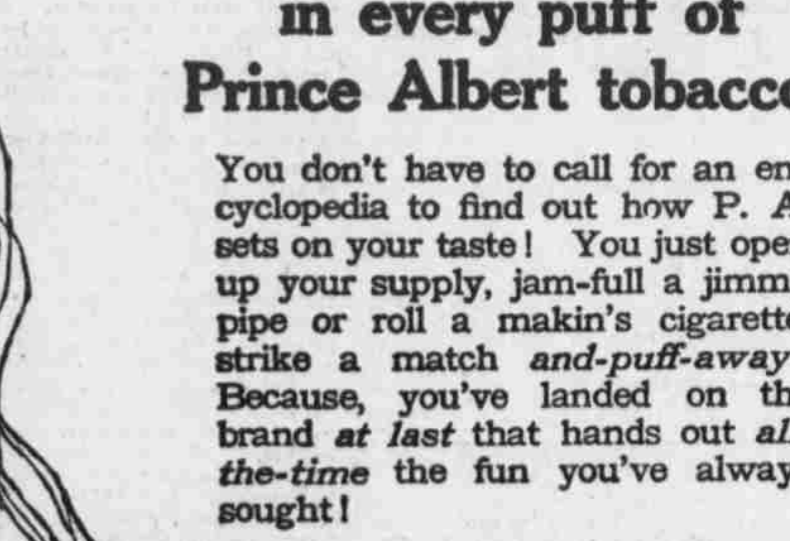
