LINCOLN, Nov. 11.-Chancellor Samuel Avery of the University of Nebrasks. tonight received a telegram from Pasadena, Cal., inviting him to permit the Nebraska foot ball team to go to Pasadena to meet a representative eleven of the Pacific coast for a game on New Year's day. The University of Washington was suggested as the probable coast team.

The telegram was sent by C. R. Weldon, president of the Southern California University of Nebraska club, acting for the Pasadena committee. Chancellor Avery did not indicate what probable action would be taken. In order to make the trip it will be necessary for the foot ball men to secure not only the consent of the University authorities, but the Missouri Valley conference.
