Metcalf Studies Retailers' System in St. Louis Stores

J. W. Metcalf, secretary of the Associated Retailers of Omaha, has returned from St. Louis, where he spent a few weeks in a minute study of the systems of the big retail stores and of the Retailers' association, with especial reference to the abuse by some customers of the privilege of taking out goods on approval and the privilege of returning goods. Mr. Metcalf will report his findings at their meeting January 12. "I find the St. Louis merchants have instituted a lot of good things in their practices," said Secretary Metcalf, "and we should be able to draw some good lessons from them. They have a good system of eliminating the abuse of the return goods privilege, and then, too, they have cut out the practice of holding clearance sales at all times of the year, which is a practice that is bad. They have gone back to a sane basis of doing business."
