

GERMAN MISSIONARIES ARE DEPORTED BY JAPANESE

YOKOHAMA, Japan, Jan. 28.—The Japanese naval transport Kahoshima Maru, which arrived yesterday from the south

Pacific, brought ten deported German missionaries, five men and five women, from the Caroline Islands, which are now occupied by a Japanese garrison. The missionaries were deported for acts alleged to be contrary to the interests of the Japanese administration. Upon arrival here they were handed

over to the American consul general through the local government authorities. It is expected that they will leave for Germany by way of the United States.

studying. Most of the line work and making of installations is being done by these people under American and Filipino supervision.

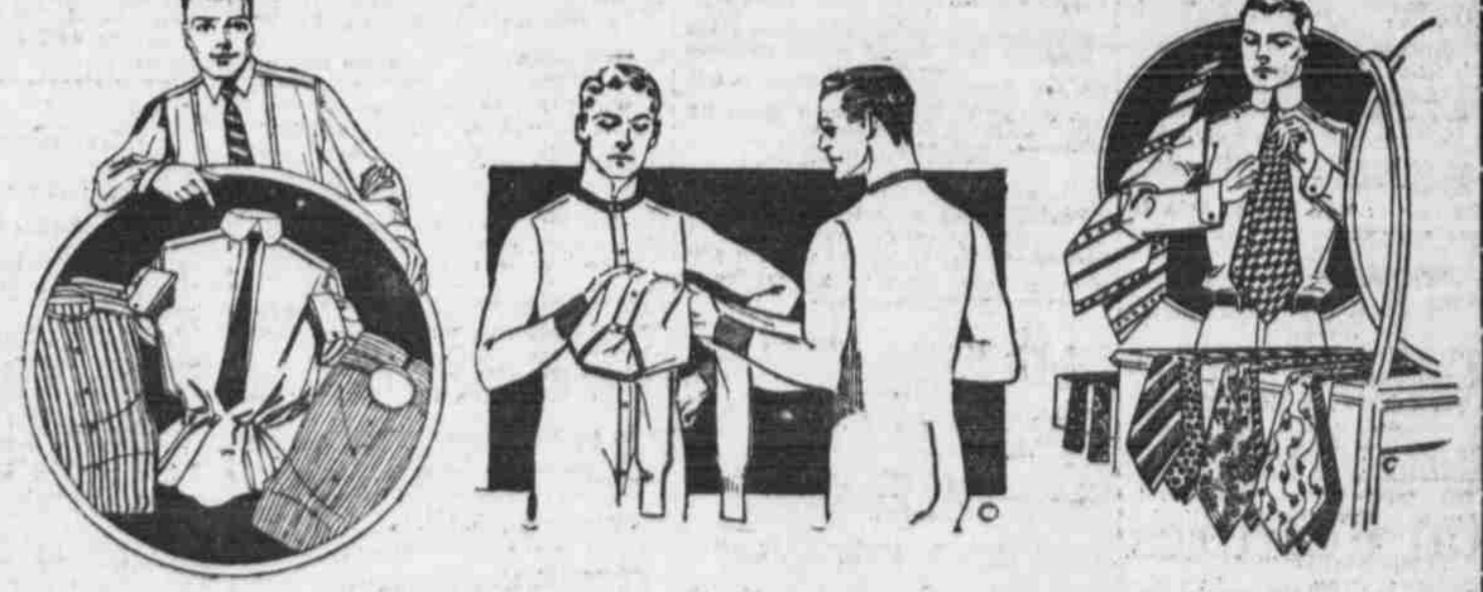
