James Blaha, local organizer, made the announcement of the introduction of the new schedule, Wednesday. Similar demands will be made throughout the country.

No strike will result if the packers fail to meet the demands, for the local organization has an agreement with the government not to strike for a year.

ARCHBISHOP HARTY SPEAKS FOR KNIGHTS

America Vast Mobilization Camp and Time Has Arrived to Consecrate Wealth for Soldiers' Sake.

Archbishop J. J. Hartly yesterday issued an appeal in behalf of the Knights of Columbus drive for funds. He said:

"America has become a vast mobilization camp. The flower of our young manhood is in training to become officers. The vigor and courage of America has been drafted into the army, fathers, mothers and sisters have willingly given up loved sons and brothers to danger and death.

"If any of our boys fail, it will not be for lack of mental power. In all the history of the world there has never been a complete failure that has not been due to moral weakness.

"The Knights of Columbus with their work in the camps will make safe the faith and morals of our boys, the priceless possessions which they have. Going hand in hand with this faith and morality will be the thought expressed in Holy Scripture: Blessed are the clean of heart, for they shall see God. Faith and morality go together. Lose one and you will lose the other.

"The hour calls for the consecration of wealth to the highest and the finest ideals of religion and manhood. We do not give this money to the Knights of Columbus. Irrespective of denominational lines we ask the knights to be our almoners, to use the money in the cantonments and over seas for our boys. We look on those as sacred to God and country, as shines not to be desecrated by pollution, or degraded by preventable disease.

"The Knights of Columbus fund will provide means for the health of soul and body. The Knights of Columbus will aim to invest the physical aspect of life with something of the sacredness of religion. Weakness of fiber, indeed, is poor material out of which to build a man or a soldier. This movement stands for the moral, physical, and intellectual advancement of our army and navy."
