

NEW EXPLOSION IN ROMANCE OF DOUBLE WEDDING

Mrs. Edna Braley Follows Suit of Sister and Asks Court to Relieve Her of Her Spouse.

Mrs. Edna Braley, until last Sunday Miss Edna Robinson, one of two sisters to figure in a double marriage ceremony on that day, Thursday in district court filed suit for divorce from John Braley, to whom she was married at the same time that her sister, Alice, wed Herman H. Mohring. The couples were married by Rev. H. H. Hancock of Trinity Cathedral.

And thus does the romance of both sides of a double marriage go fading into the land of regrets, even as the soap bubble bursts when it attains its most magnificent beauty!

For Mrs. Edward M. Robinson mother of the two girls, and Mrs. Alice Mohring, as plaintiffs, Wednesday filed suit for annulment of Alice's marriage. Mrs. Robinson says that her daughter was but 14 years old at the time of her marriage and that Mohring misrepresented this fact when he told Marriage License Clerk Furry that his bride-to-be was 18 years old.

Induced Through Fraud.

The latest petition, filed by Edna, the elder daughter, who is 24 years old, alleges that through fraud and false statements as to his name, identity, character and property therein made to her by Braley, she was induced to marry him. She alleges she learned of his fraudulent representations soon after the marriage, which knowledge has destroyed her happiness and she seeks divorce.

"My daughters were forced into this marriage by fear," the mother, Mrs. Robinson, says. "My girls, both of whom I have used the utmost care in raising, are entirely unfamiliar with worldly affairs and when the two young men proposed marriage they arranged it so that my daughters would be afraid to tell their mother of the plans."

Mrs. Robinson says that she allowed her daughters to go out with Mohring and Braley Sunday afternoon, ostensibly to attend a moving picture show. She says that the four young people started out in an automobile and drove instead to the minister.

Lt. C. E. Campbell of Omaha Arrives Safely in France

Lieut. C. E. Campbell, Jr., has arrived safely overseas, according to a cable received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Campbell, 1124 South Twenty-eighth street.

Lieutenant Campbell was born and raised in the army and, like many others, he responded to the first call of his country in the present emergency.

He is a graduate of Omaha Central High school and had completed his third year at the State University at Lincoln, where he was captain of cadets. He joined the first training camp at Fort Snelling, where he received a commission as second lieutenant and was ordered to report to Camp Lodge, Iowa for duty, and was assigned to Company "F" 350th Regiment, 88th Division. He was promoted to first lieutenant January 1, 1918.

Receiver for Nebraska

Blaugas Company is Asked

A petition was filed in district court Thursday by Dorus M. Alderman against the defunct Nebraska Blaugas Co. to appoint a receiver for the corporation for the purpose of suing Allen W. Sleeper, Sheldon, Ia., for \$300,000, the amount of capital stock alleged to have been issued to Mr. Sleeper and whom it is alleged, paid nothing for such stock and is consequently liable under Nebraska statutes for the full amount.

Mr. Alderman alleges that he recovered a judgment amounting to \$7,798 on October 20, 1916, and on which he has been unable to make a recovery; that there is an aggregate of \$30,000 indebtedness, with no assets other than the alleged liability of Mr. Sleeper, and asks for the appointment of the receiver to prosecute suit for the full amount he is alleged to owe for his stock.

F. R. Bumpus Expects to Go in September Contingent

E. R. Bumpus, manager and editor of the Implement and Tractor Trade Journal, with offices in the W. O. W. building, expects to be called sometime in September as one of Omaha's contingents in the draft call for that month.
