## Yankees Have Clinched Flag If Dope Repeats

Cleveland, Sept. 2.—If history repeats, the Yankees yesterday clinched the American league pennant by their two victories over Washington. Statistics prepared by a local sporting editor show that never in the history of the league has the team which was in the lead on September 1 lost the pennant.

The figures show, however, that the team at the top of the standing on this date did not always maintain the lead until the end of the season. In 1904 the Red Sox did not win the pennant from New York until the last day of the season, but the record for September 1 shows Boston was leading.

In 1908, Detroit was the leader September 2 and won the pennant only after a three-cornered fight with Cleveland and Chicago.

Last year, the White Sox led the league with a three-point margin over the Indians August 31. The next day Chicago beat and Cleveland won, the latter team eventually winning the pennant and the world's championship.
