

Lines Be Merged Into 19 Systems

Plan of Harvard Professor. To Be Considered by I. C. C., Similar to One At-

By HOLLAND. Soon after Charles S. Mellen became president of the New Haven railroad system he began to formulate plans for the consolidation into a single system of all except two of the railroads in New England. He was warmly supported in his pur-pose by J. P. Morgan. President Mellen's argument in favor of con-solidation of the New England roads was based upon the certainty in his opinion of securing greater economies in the operation of the railroads, better service for the manufacturers of New England and possibly the ultimate electrification of
